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Rubric for Digital Images Quest 4: The Science Mythbusters!

SCORE	CRITERIA
Level 1-Beginner	The project is incomplete; missing one or more of the elements listed below. The work may reflect little research or it may be missing information to help bust or validate the myth. The project may or may not reflect modifications (including titles) on the images, or the author may not have selected images that fit the requirements: copyright-free, appropriate size, and matching the text well.
Level 2-Novice	The project may or may not be complete (see elements below). There may be some missing information or the images may or may not fit well with the information being presented.
Level 3-Apprentice	The project is complete. Suggestions for improvement may include adding more detail to support a slide, choosing more appropriate images for the text, or improving the presentation by checking spelling.
Level 4-Journeyman	The project is complete and the elements are all present. The information presented is interesting and the viewer will be informed about the topic after viewing it.
Level 5-Expert	The project is complete and has all the elements listed below and includes the Bonus. Watching this presentation will inform and entertain the viewer. The student does a good job of editing digital images and matching them to text and music using the selected program to create a well-rounded digital slideshow.
