

VSLA OFIE T. RUBIN LITERACY TEACHER OF THE YEAR GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION

Description/Overview:

- Award recognizes a teacher (teaching literacy 1/3 of each school day) in K-12 whose commitment to literacy is exemplary/unparalleled.
- Each local chapter may nominate one teacher for this award.
- The Ofie T. Rubin Literacy Teacher of the Year Committee will review all candidate applications using a scoring rubric to determine the recipient.
- All candidates may be asked to participate in an informal round table discussion session, to be scheduled during the VSLA conference.
- All candidates will be recognized during the VSLA Conference.
- The candidate selected as the Ofie T. Rubin Literacy Teacher of the Year will receive a \$1000 Professional Development Award at the conference. This award is made to the individual and is considered taxable income.

Eligibility/Instructions:

The candidate

- must be a member of the VSLA and a local chapter for at least one year prior to submitting the application
- must teach literacy a minimum of one-third of each school day to students in grades K-12
- must include verification form by their local chapter president

Required Items-SUBMIT IN THIS ORDER TO:

- 1. Verification form completed by the local chapter president
- 2. Candidate's vitae (2 pages / 30 points) include:
 - educational background / professional experience (last 5 years) (4 points)
 - professional affiliations, achievements, education/community involvement (26 points)
- 3. Two letters of recommendation
 - Principal / Supervisor letters must be on letterhead (5 points)
 - Colleague/parent (5 points) LETTERS MUST HAVE SIGNATURES
- 4. The candidate's literacy philosophy- (1 page / 25 points)
- 5. Candidate's proposal for using the \$1000.00 Ofie T. Rubin Literacy Teacher of the Year Award-(1 page/35 points)
- 6. A digital photo (jpg file) of the candidate with name, address, and local chapter (2 points)
