- ✓ Support new families, including pre-K, transfers, and special education transitions
- Create a School-Family Compact to define shared responsibilities
- ✓ Use the Dual Capacity Framework to build meaningful engagement
- ✔ Provide training for staff on family partnerships
- ✓ Share info in families' home languages
- ✔ Allocate funds for childcare, transportation, interpreters
- ✔ Promote involvement in PTA and parent leadership opportunities
