Watercolor Foundations I - Full Supply List:

What To Bring:

Paints: Tubes in the following colors: Lemon Yellow Hue, New Gamboge, Quinacridone Rose, Alizarin Crimson, Ultramarine, Cerulean Blue, Phthalo Blue (green shade), Sap Green, Yellow Ochre, and Sepia. I highly recommend the following brands: Winsor and Newton professional paints or Daniel Smith. However, if you're looking for a more affordable brand to get started, Winsor and Newton Cotman paints are a great starter set. I personally use all Daniel Smith watercolors in my palette. I do *not* recommend cake pans for frequent use in class. They are better suited for travel and small paintings.

PLEASE NOTE: You will have the best experience with your watercolors if you fill your pallet before attending class. We will get started painting right when class begins, so make sure your pallets are filled with color before you're in the studio! That way you can be ready to go.

Palettes: Any that has at least 18 slots with a lid of some kind. Blick Art Materials on 2100 S here in Salt Lake has some great options.

Brushes: Round brushes from any brand in sizes or #4 and #12. I personally use this brush in class: Princeton Velvetouch Series 3950 Synthetic Brush - Long Round, in size 12 or 14 - It's great, lasts long, and in my opinion, is all you need for most pieces!

Watercolor Sketchbook: Any brand or size will do as long as it has a paper weight of at least 140lb/200gsm. We will put all our warm-up practices in this! I love Strathmore 400 Series watercolor art journals. 100% cotton paper is a bit more expensive but the quality is unmatched.
