The Georgia state minimum wage is \$5.15. Employees covered under the federal Fair Labor Standards Act are subject to the federal minimum wage of \$7.25, but those not covered under the FLSA may be paid the state minimum wage of \$5.15.

**Fun Fact:** The wage above is the Georgia state min. wage...However, the federal min. wage overrides the state wage! Eighteen states began the new year with **higher** minimum wages than the national average. Eight states (Alaska, Florida, Minnesota, Montana, New Jersey, Ohio, South Dakota, and Vermont) automatically increased their rates based on the **cost of living**, while ten states (Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Maine, Massachusetts, Missouri, New York, Rhode Island and Washington) increased their rates due to previously approved legislation or ballot initiatives. Other states that will see rate increases during the 2019 calendar year include: D.C., Delaware, Michigan, and Oregon.

The **cost of living** is the amount of money needed to sustain a certain standard of **living** by affording basic expenses such as housing, food, taxes, and health care. The **cost of living** is often used to compare how expensive it is to **live** in one city versus another. The **cost of living** is tied to wages. Feb 27, 2019
