Pastor's Pen:

Most of us, especially those of us who are Christian grandparents, grew up with a great appreciation for the country in which we live, especially the freedoms we have to worship in a manner consistent with our biblical convictions.

Sadly, the evidence is mounting that our culture is rapidly moving in an anti-biblical direction. Cancel culture, sexual distortion, critical race theory and other cultural shifts have penetrated our public education system and our society as a whole.

An article in the September '22 Hillsdale College newsletter pointed out that "Sadly, in many of our nation's classrooms, great stories of American achievement are either ignored or presented as evidence of America's history of oppression and racism. The result is a generation of young Americans who have been robbed of a true account of history...."

Who would have thought 15 or 20 years ago than kindergarteners would be told that there are more than two genders, and that you can select your own-- in shocking contrast to the biblical evidence of Genesis 2 and the clear statement of Jesus recorded in Matthew 19:4 and Mark 10:6.

Who would have imagined that, in many cities across America, statues of our founding fathers, including George Washington and even Abraham Lincoln, have either been removed or attempts have been made to remove them.

How did this happen? Of even greater importance, what can we do about it?

The growing drift toward 'woke' in our country has been taking place for decades, but over the past several years it has rapidly picked up speed. In many states teachers have already been indoctrinated with critical race theory and other counterculture philosophies, and students will find many of their classes influenced by these ideologies. In our society, many in the younger generation now identify as "nones," that is those who have no religious affiliation at all. Clearly we are already living in a post-Christian era.

I believe, based on these developments, that we as grandparents have a responsibility to do everything we can to pass along the values of faith, family and freedom which were passed on to us. So how can we carry this out?

For one thing, we can pray for each one of our grandchildren by name. Along with this, make it a point to learn what is taking place in their lives. Are they struggling in school? Have they been bullied? Do they seem to be turning away from the Faith?

Another important action step is to look for opportunities to build a close relationship with them. In our "Grandcoaching" course we emphasize two important strategies: active listening, and asking cultivating

questions. The good news is, while taking the course will sharpen your ability to use these relationship-building tools, you can begin to implement them now. The use of these skills will take that relationship much further than a lecture on "What's wrong with your behaviors."
