Bullying Policy – Parent Overview

At Mulberry School, we believe every child deserves to feel **safe**, **respected**, **and valued**. We have a **zero-tolerance policy for bullying**, including physical, verbal, social, or online behaviors that hurt, exclude, or target others.

What is Bullying?

In young children, bullying can look like:

- Repeated name-calling or teasing
- Excluding someone from play on purpose
- Telling others not to be friends with someone
- Hitting, kicking, pushing, or spitting
- Spreading unkind stories or rumors

Bullying can happen in person or online and is **never acceptable** at school, during school activities, or through school devices.

Our Approach

We work to **prevent bullying** by:

- Teaching and modeling kind, respectful behavior
- Setting clear rules and expectations
- Helping children understand feelings and friendships
- Using age-appropriate consequences for hurtful behavior
- Encouraging children to speak up and seek help from an adult

- Provide verbal warnings and support
- Meet with families to make a plan
- Refer the matter to our Board of Directors if bullying continues
- In serious cases, remove privileges or consider further consequences, including possible removal from the program

We Do Not Allow Retaliation

Children and families will **never be punished** for reporting concerns. We are here to listen, protect, and support.
