The Rector's Corner for Spiritual Growth and Development

The Prayer Priority

Lord, teach us to pray (Luke 11:1)

Prayer has always been a primary mark of the saints of God in every generation of the church. George Whitefield, who retired punctually at 10 p.m. every night, rose equally promptly early in the morning to pray. John Wesley spent two hours daily in prayer, and commonly said that 'God does nothing, but in answer to prayer'. Martin Luther commented, if I fail to spend two hours in prayer each morning, the devil gets the victory through the day. I have so much business that I cannot get on without spending three hours in daily prayer.'

The leaders of the Clapham movement, such as William Wilberforce, who initiated enormous social reforms in England, habitually gave themselves to three hours of prayer each day. They organized Christians throughout the country to unite in special prayer before critical debate in Parliament. They knew and persistently proved the power of prayer. William Temple replied to his critics who regarded answered prayers as no more than coincidences, 'When I pray, coincidences happen; when I don't pray, they don't happen.'

With such examples of the heroes of faith, it is hard not to feel a crushing failure. It may not be surprising that most Christians are ashamed of the poverty of their prayer life. In western society in particular, we are consumed by activism, and have lost the prayerful meditation of our Eastern brethren. The prayer of those first disciples, then, is highly relevant for us – Lord, teach us to prayer.

A question to be asked by every Christian: 'How can I rearrange my life, so that I can spend more time in prayer daily?
