

The <u>Pulaski County-wide Plan</u> was developed in coordination with Eastern Pulaski Schools and the Pulaski County Health Department. Below are further actions specific to our campus and buildings based on current conditions.

# West Central School Corporation Specific Protocols During Fall 2020 Reopening

This list is not exhaustive, nor does it detail how we'll handle every specific situation. Much more will be done on a day-to-day basis than is listed here.

We believe these measures provide sufficient protection for students and staff while allowing for the necessary learning opportunities our students need to continue to grow and develop into well-rounded and productive citizens.

#### Overall

- High-touch surfaces such as light switches and door knobs will be cleaned regularly
- Staff, students, and adults in the building will self-screen for symptoms and remain home if symptoms are present
- Hand sanitizer, touchless water bottle filling stations, and other touch-mitigation options will be available
- Blanket policy exemptions will be drafted to provide some relief from policies penalizing excessive absences by students, staff, and others who might be affected
- Mask use in schools is required for grades 3 and higher as well as for faculty and staff, volunteers, and anyone else in schools based on the Governor's Executive Order. Masks are also required for any person who rides a school bus
- Masks are not required when:
  - Students are eating or drinking
  - Students are at recess and can social distance
  - Students are spaced at least 6 ft, apart
  - Students are at least 3 ft apart, seated at their desks, and all facing the same direction receiving instruction or doing seatwork
- Distance/virtual learning options will be provided for students and families who are quarantined, have high-risk members in their households, or would like to remain enrolled in West Central but are concerned about COVID-19 (please contact your building principal if you are interested in a virtual option)

- All plans are subject to change due to the fluid nature of COVID-19 and its continuing development

#### Offices

- Plexi-glass dividers will be installed between office staff and patrons
- Thermometers will be available at every office for checking symptoms

#### Classrooms

- Pump hand sanitizers will be available in every classroom
- Spray sanitizers and food/people safe sanitizer will be used regularly in common areas
- Student desks will be spaced out as much as reasonable and facing the same direction

#### **Nurse Stations**

- The school nurse will be provided with extensive PPE and equipment to check for symptoms and handle potential COVID-19 cases
- COVID-19 containment spots will be used to sequester probable COVID-19 cases until those individuals can be sent home

## **Hallways**

- Pump hand sanitizer stations will be available in common areas
- Students will avoid congregating in one place and be spurred upon to quickly go to their lockers and move quickly to class
- Drinking fountains will be turned off, with water bottling filling stations available for student use
- Extra handwashing stations will be available for handwashing

#### Cafeteria

- Breakfast will be served in classrooms with extra cafeteria staff as needed for prep for quick distribution of meals
- Food will be arranged to expedite the serving process to avoid students congregating in line
- Cafeteria spaces will be socially distanced to the extent possible, with tables bring spread out and limited students at each table
- For extra room, the gymnasiums and other spaces may be used to further spread out students as necessary
- Elementary-level cafeteria will be limited to one grade-level at a time or two grade-levels when numbers permit

- Seating charts will be used for contact tracing purposes
- Middle/high school cafeteria will be socially distanced with the space available and lunch periods added

#### Recess

- Elementary recess will be staggered one grade-level at a time or two grade-levels when numbers in grades are smaller
- Students will wash hands or sanitize upon re-entering the building and regularly throughout the day

## PE/Music/Weight Room

- Classes will be conducted outside when possible and spaced out as appropriate
- Band/choir ensembles will be spaced out within the room, as numbers are small enough to make this a possibility
- Weight room/PE room/equipment will be disinfected after use
- Elementary specials may be conducted in classrooms as needed

#### **Buses**

- Bus drivers will be encouraged to wear facemasks that do not impinge on their ability to drive
- Parents will be encouraged to drive their students to lower the number of students riding the bus
- Bus routes will be reconfigured to lower the number of students on each bus after determining final numbers of students
- Windows will be open to the extent possible that driver/passengers are comfortable
- Seating charts will be utilized to group family members
- Buses will be sprayed with disinfectant after every route

# Other Items as Part of the Reopening Reopening

- Parents will need training/reminders to not send symptomatic students to school
- Students training will need to include handwashing, distancing from peers, and mask wearing if masks are desired
- Group staff PD and meetings will be postponed/adjusted to allow for social distancing between adults
- Teachers will need guidance on distance learning and responsibilities may need shifting/adjustments to balance workloads

## Screening/Symptoms Procedures

- All screening/symptom procedures can be overridden by the county health department (the following are guidelines based on current information)
- Students/parents and staff members are responsible for self-screening before coming to school. Those with a temperature meeting or exceeding 100.4 degrees or exhibiting other symptoms of COVID-19 as defined by the CDC should stay home
- Students removed from the school environment who have not tested positive for COVID-19 will be allowed to return if they have been fever free for 48 hours without fever-reducing medication and do not exhibit other visible symptoms of COVID-19
- Students removed from the school environment who have tested positive for COVID-19 will be allowed to return to school if they have tested negative for COVID-19 and have been fever and symptom free for at least 48 hours

## **Procedures for Confirmed Cases**

- After it has been confirmed a household member of someone from school has COVID-19, all household members will be quarantined from school for 10 calendar days. They may return to school when they have tested negative for COVID-19 and have been fever and symptom free for the at least 48 hours
- After it is confirmed that a person infected with COVID-19 was on school property, the following steps will be taken:
  - The Pulaski County Health Department will be notified
  - The Indiana Department of Education will be notified
  - The area(s) where the infected person traveled will be sanitized
  - Close contacts as defined by the Department of Health as being within 6
    feet of someone else for more than 15 minutes will be removed from
    school for a minimum of 48 hours and may not return until they have been
    fever and symptom free for at least 48 hours

### Communication Protocol

- COVID-10 related questions shall be forwarded to designated COVID-19 district contacts, which will include designated secretaries and administration. No certified-staff or non-certified staff should answer any questions unless designated to do so
- No personal information regarding who has/has not tested positive for COVID-19 shall be shared at any time
