A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Tēnā tatou katoa e te whānau

Term 4 is my favourite time to see our learners in action. They have spent time being equipped with skills and knowledge throughout the year, so it's at this point where their desire and confidence to explore is most obvious. Upon visiting Year 2 last week, the students told me about their interests, like giraffes, and their strengths, like basketball. They told me about their plan to explore these areas and what they could do with their learning. This is our vision in action! Similarly, you'd also see it in action with the Senior students at swimming this week. They are using their skills they have been equipped with in order to progress through the water safety challenges set by the EzySwim tutors. I promise the squeals you can hear from the pool are 'good squeals'!
