Cross Country

The Middle School Cross Country team had their biggest race of the season last night in Dewitt at the Jr. Greater Lansing Cross Country Championships. The boys and girls team competed against 36 of the top teams in the area and 846 total runners. On the boys side, Ezra Nellis finished 9th for Corunna followed by teammates Ben Hansen 23rd, Braden Hartuff 42nd, and McKinley Springer 46th to earn medals. Sawyer Benn was Corunna's 5th runner helping the team hold on to 4th place overall. In the JV race Jackson Donley came home with a medal finishing 35th.

On the girl's side, Jaidyn Nickels finished 17th to bring home a medal. Marley Meyer finished 96 to be the only other girl to finish in the top 100 runners. Emmie Hebekeuser was the only runner on the day to improve their best time. In the JV race for the girls Abigail Bentler finished 38th and Faith Bannister finished 45th to capture medals.

Next up is the team's last race of the season this Saturday at the Shiawassee County Championships right here at home. Come on out to watch the Jr. Cavs bring home the County Championships. It will be exciting.
