US Department of Education Releases Climate Adaptation Plan

On September 15th, the Department of Education posted its 2021 [Climate Adaptation Plan](#) ([see blog](#)). This is great progress, and the COE's Green Schools Working Group this Spring will support our districts to continue working to be at the leading edge. There is an opportunity here for education leaders to provide feedback to the Dept of Ed by September 22 on the plan. Here are three highlights from the plan:

- This latest Climate Adaptation Plan names Cindy Marten, Deputy Secretary for the Department of Education, to lead implementation of this plan.
- The plan acknowledges that climate change is no longer a theoretical threat to the department's mission, but rather a present and grave one.
- The department commits to a powerful set of actions that, if

effectively implemented with urgency, will put the Department of Education on a path of strong climate leadership.

Education leaders can help the Department move forward by engaging in a survey. [Read the plan](#) (the description of the "priority actions", which represent the core of implementation, starts on page 8) and provide your thoughts on how the Department can work effectively in these priority areas by completing [this survey](#). **Most questions are optional and the survey is structured to accommodate those respondents who only have 5 min as well as those who can provide more extensive thoughts. The survey can be shared with others.** Feedback submitted by WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 will be shared with members of the Department during the week of September 27.

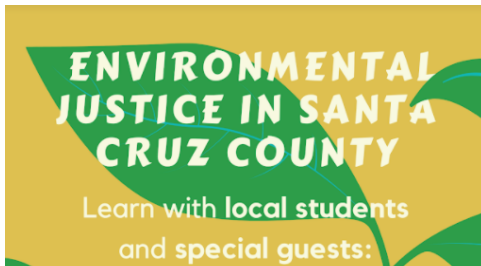

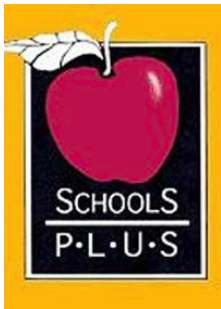

Six Free Tools for Teaching about Climate Change--for grades 3-12



As part of the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), students need to "ask questions to clarify evidence of the factors that have caused the rise in global temperatures over the past century." Digital resources can support these practices when teaching about climate change:

- Using models to understand the fundamental processes that help shape Earth's climate.
- Arguing the causes of global temperature rise; like scientists, students should be holding those same debates.
- Exploring data to practice interpreting real evidence and arriving at their own conclusions.

Here are six free tools that incorporate those practices and can be used immediately in the classroom to help students become climate change scientists.
