A Bill Regarding Types of Legislation

A BILL OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY SENATE TO AMEND THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY CODE BY CLARIFYING TYPES OF LEGISLATION BY SENATE IN [Title (II.c)], WHICH FOR THE SAKE OF BREVITY AND IN INTEREST OF BEING MORE DESCRIPTIVE, THE CURRENT AND ALTERED FORM MAY BE FOUND ATTACHED.

WHEREAS, The mission of the Associated Student Body (ASB) is "to serve selflessly and to represent justly the student body," "elevating the student voice," and to "provide an advocacy resource for students on campus," (ASB Mission Statement);

WHEREAS, The purpose of ASB "is to deal effectively with matters of student affairs... for the best interest of the student body as a whole and to the credit of The University of Mississippi," (ASB Constitution, Article I, Section II. Purpose);

WHEREAS, a restructuring of ASB Senate legislative titling would help focus and define the powers, jurisdictions, and purposes of types of legislation;

WHEREAS, the duties of Resolutions and Proclamations listed currently all fall under the interpreted duties of Resolutions;

WHEREAS, this bill allows Resolutions to be strengthened and seen as to be actionable and an item crucial to the continued success and growth of the student body;

WHEREAS, Resolutions will be a call for any deserving persons to move or perform an action;

WHEREAS, Proclamations will give space for the Senate to congratulate accomplishments and to thank contributions of administration, faculty, staff, organizations, sport teams, elected officials, community leaders, students, and any other deserving persons;

WHEREAS, Proclamations will be able to support, oppose, or defend any action, both internally and externally, that the Senate feels will majorly affect a portion or entirety of the student body at the University of Mississippi;

WHEREAS, Proclamations will be able to extend new or underused resources to students to encourage use and assistance, AND;

WHEREAS, this bill does not limit or restrict any future interpretations of what each form of legislation can and should do, but is a strong suggestion of what can best serve the University of Mississippi and the Associated Student Body;

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED THAT THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY SENATE AMEND [Title (II.c)] REGARDING TYPES OF LEGISLATION PRODUCED BY THE ASB SENATE PER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AND SENATE GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS COMMITTEE.
