

# Youth Co:Lab COVID-19 Response: Compilation of Policy Resources For Those 'Small Enough to Fail'

The COVID-19 crisis is affecting firms of all sizes - but micro, small, medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) and informal sector workers are particularly at risk. Young entrepreneurs and young workers are disproportionately impacted - as the crisis amplifies their existing vulnerabilities.

<u>Youth Co:Lab</u>-UNDP conducted a rapid survey to assess how youth enterprises in Asia-Pacific were being impacted by COVID-19 (see results). In April we reviewed early policy responses from across Asia-Pacific relevant to MSMEs and informal sector workers (<u>COVID-19 Policy Responses for Those Small Enough to Fail</u> & a longer <u>stocktake of Asia-Pacific examples</u>).

In this <u>part 2 blog</u> (8th May), we discuss how to structure COVID-19 policy responses to support those 'small enough to fail' <u>and</u> rebuild our economies in ways that reduce their vulnerability in the long run.

Below we have compiled policy trackers, guidance notes, articles, and other resources which we hope will be helpful for practitioners seeking to design policy or programmatic responses to mitigate the impacts of the crisis on MSMEs, informal sector workers, and their households.

#### 1. Latest Forecasts of Global and Asia-Pacific Economic Impact

a) IMF World Economic Outlook April 2020: The Great Lockdown [14/4/20]: The IMF projects global growth in 2020 to fall to -3 percent (downgrade of 6.3 points since



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January). For the first time since the Great Depression, both advanced economies and emerging and developing economies are in recession. Income per capita is projected to shrink for over 170 countries. Growth in Asia-Pacific is expected to stall at zero percent in 2020 - the worst in 60 years. See <a href="Asia-Pacific outlook">Asia-Pacific outlook</a> and <a href="Country-specific forecasts">COVID-19</a>, countries have taken fiscal actions of \$8 trillion.

- b) ILO Monitor 4th Edition: COVID-19 and the world of work: The number of hours worked in the first quarter of 2020 declined by 6.5 per cent in Asia and the Pacific (driven by an 11.6 per cent decrease in East Asia). In the second quarter of 2020 working hours in Asia and the Pacific are projected to drop by 10 per cent.
- c) ILO Monitor 3rd Edition: COVID-19 and the World of Work [29/4/20]: ILO projects that in Asia-Pacific the COVID-19 crisis will wipe out ten percent of working hours equivalent to 175 million full-time workers in the second quarter of 2020. The first month of the crisis is estimated to have resulted in a drop of 21.6 percent in the income of informal workers in Asia and the Pacific. As of 22nd April, there were 829 million informal economy workers in the region in countries with full or partial lockdowns.
- d) ILO Brief: COVID-19 crisis and the informal economy [7/5/20]: Almost 1.6 billion of the world's 2 billion informal economy workers are significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to a 60 per cent decline in their earnings.
- e) <u>ILO's series of COVID-19 sectoral briefs</u>, which provide a preliminary assessment of the impact of COVID-19 on specific social and economic sectors and industries
- f) UN Secretary General Shared responsibility, global solidarity: Responding to the socio-economic impacts of COVID-19: describes the speed and scale of the outbreak, the severity of cases, and the societal and economic disruption of COVID-19.
- g) <u>UNU-WIDER: Impact of COVID-19 on Global Poverty</u> [8/4/20]: projects that the economic fallout from the pandemic could push an additional 368.6 million people in Asia-Pacific into poverty (239.8 million additional people in East Asia & Pacific and 128.8 million additional in South Asia could be pushed under the \$5.50 poverty line).
- h) The World Bank applies new World Economic Outlook growth projections to PovcalNet data, and finds that COVID-19 is likely to cause the first global increase in poverty since 1998. Projects COVID-19 will push 49 million people into extreme poverty in 2020.
- i) <u>APEC in the Epicentre of COVID-19</u>: projects real GDP in APEC will contract by 2.7 percent in 2020 (down from last year's 3.6 percent growth), translating to an estimated output loss of USD 2.1 trillion.
- j) <u>ADB Asian Development Outlook 2020</u> [3/4/20]: ADB forecast regional growth to decline from 5.2% last year to 2.2% in 2020. A longer containment scenario is projected to lead to \$690 billion losses for China (5% of GDP), and \$200 billion losses for the rest of LMICs in Asia (2.2% of GDP). See country-specific projections.
- k) WTO Trade Forecast [8/4/20]: WTO projects that world trade will fall by between 13% and 32% in 2020. Exports from North America and Asia will be hit hardest.
- l) <u>UNWTO COVID-19 World Tourism Review</u> [8/5/20]: 100% of destinations worldwide have COVID-19 related travel restrictions for international tourists in place and 72% have placed a complete stop on international tourism as of 27 April 2020.
- m) World Bank April 2020 Economic Update for East Asia and the Pacific [30/3/20]: projects growth in developing EAP to slow to 2.1% in the baseline and to -0.5% in the



- lower-case scenario in 2020, from an estimated 5.8% in 2019. In the lower-case scenario, poverty is expected to increase by 11 million. See country-specific projections. Growth forecast to decline sharply in Malaysia, Thailand and Timor-Leste.
- n) World Bank South Asia Economic Focus, Spring 2020 [12/4/20]: projects regional growth will fall to a range between 1.8 and 2.8% in 2020, down from 6.3% projected six months ago. That would be the region's worst performance in the last 40 years. Worst-case scenario in which the region would experience negative growth this year. See country-specific projections.
- o) <u>UNCTAD</u> [26/3/20] estimates that the pandemic could cut global investment by 40% in 2020-21. Commodity-rich exporting countries will face a \$2 trillion to \$3 trillion drop in investment in the next two years.
- p) World Bank projects global remittances will decline by about 20 percent in 2020 due to the economic crisis [22/4/20]
