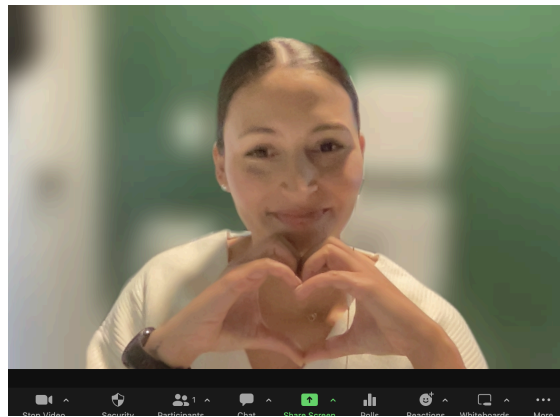
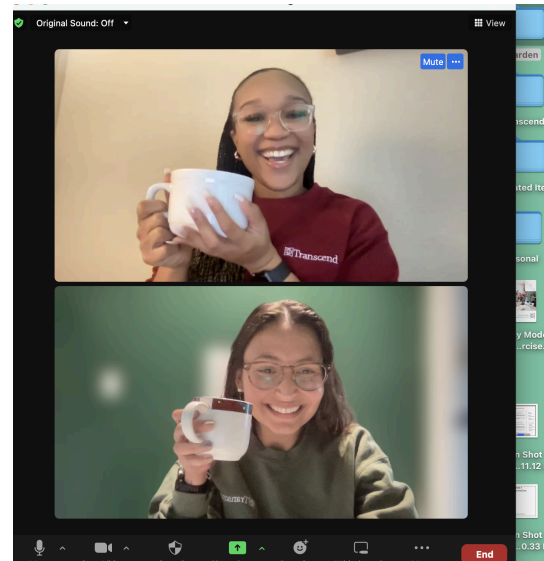
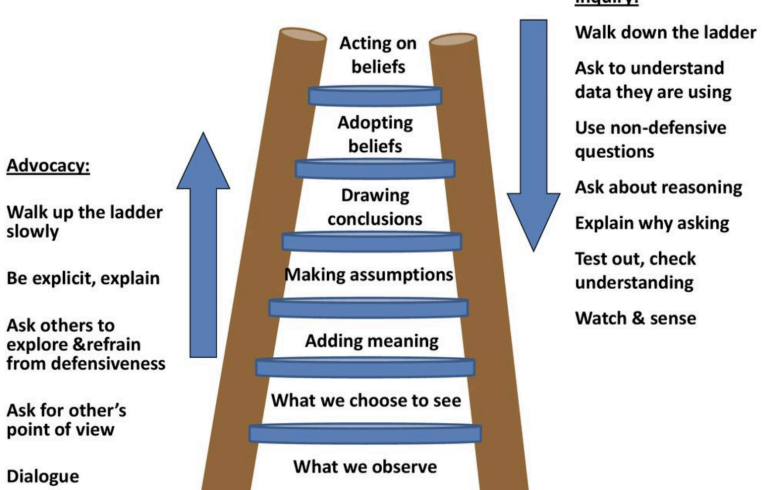
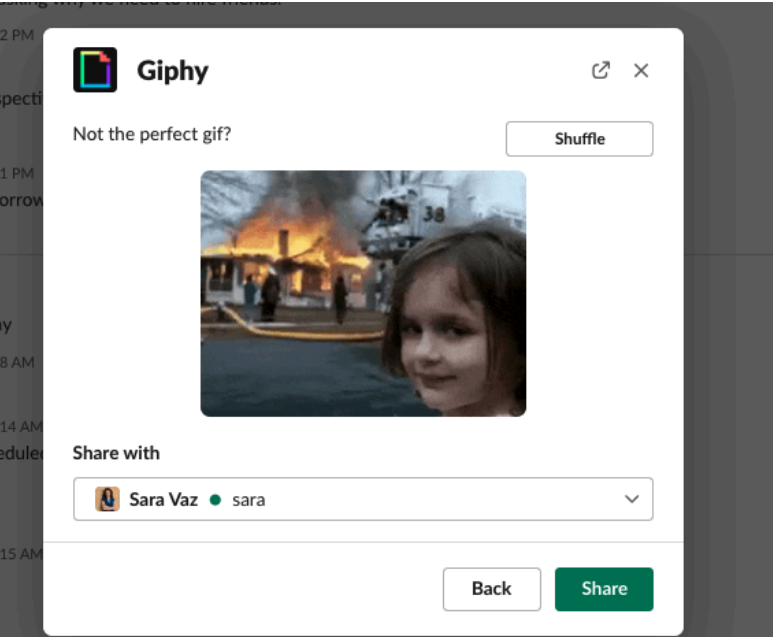
First coat of paint	This means a first draft!	
Sprint	A collaborative effort to prioritize a project and build ideas in a short period.	
Wiggling fingers on zoom	“sending love” / “that really resonates with me”	Video
Making a heart with hands-on zoom	“sending love” / “offering support”	
GEPO	Good Enough, Push On. AKA: “This doesn’t have to be polished, let’s run with this at this level of completion/ polish/ information.”	Video
Scrappy and Happy	This means that it’s okay for a draft and that that product/document does not need to be fully finished or flushed out.	

Table Setting or set the table	Providing the groundwork, lay of the land, or other early information necessary to the conversation that will follow. It means Sharing Context.	Video
Strongly held	Code for “this is a hill I’m willing to die on” / I’ll fight for this one	Video
Strong opinion, loosely held	This gives you the option to say something bold but let people know you are open to discussing it.	Alternatively: “feel a 5/10 [or 9/10] intensity about this” or use “Fist to Five” as a quick way to gauge how a group is feeling about where we are, a particular recommendation or decision, etc.
Sticky	A way of explaining something so it’s remembered/understood.

Advocacy and Inquiry + The Ladder of Inference	Additional context here	Ladder of Inference  Advocacy: - Walk up the ladder slowly - Be explicit, explain - Ask others to explore & refrain from defensiveness - Ask for other's point of view - Dialogue Inquiry: - Walk down the ladder - Ask to understand data they are using - Use non-defensive questions - Ask about reasoning - Explain why asking - Test out, check understanding - Watch & sense The ladder steps from bottom to top are: What we observe, What we choose to see, Adding meaning, Making assumptions, Drawing conclusions, Adopting beliefs, Acting on beliefs.
