Welcome to remote-learning

This year, the format of our class experience will be different, but most of the learning criteria will be the same: the class schedule, the attendance, the notetaking, the participation and the assessments.

The class schedule will follow **the traditional format**: we start with the **1st period at 7:45** am and we follow the 50 minute class time plus 5 minutes between classes, until 3:00 pm. We will work **40 min in Synchronous** mode and spend **10 min on Asynchronous** mode.

Your attendance is expected daily on a Synchronous Google meet format. Your face has to be visible and you will keep your mic on mute until asked to speak. You are expected to follow teacher's instructions, take notes and participate when asked, in groups or individually. We can communicate visually and through Chat.

Course description (AP):

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course emphasizes communication (understanding and being understood by others) by applying interpersonal, interpretative, and presentation skills in real-life situations. This includes vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and culture awareness. The AP Spanish Language and Culture course strives not to overemphasize grammatical accuracy at the expense of communication. To best facilitate the study of language and culture, the course is taught in Spanish.

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course engages students in an exploration of culture in both contemporary and historical contexts. The course develops students' awareness and appreciation of cultural products (e.g., tools, books, music, laws, conventions, institutions); practices (patterns of social interactions within a culture); and perspectives (values, attitudes, and assumptions.)


Course objectives (AP):

The three modes of communication- Interpretive, interpersonal and Presentational (World Readiness Standards for Learning Languages) are a foundational to the AP Spanish Language and Culture course. The AP course provides students with opportunities to demonstrate their proficiency in each of the three modes in the Intermediate to Advance range, as described in the ACTFL performance Descriptors for Language Learners. As such, the course has been designed to provide high school students with a rich and rigorous opportunity to study the language and culture of the Spanish speaking world.

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course takes a holistic approach to language proficiency and recognizes the complex interrelatedness of comprehension and comprehensibility, vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and cultural awareness. Students should learn language structures in context and use them to convey meaning. In standards-based world language classrooms, the instructional focus is on function and not the examination of irregularity and complex grammatical paradigms about the target

language. The AP Spanish Language and Culture course strives to promote both fluency and accuracy in the language use and avoid overemphasis on grammatical accuracy at the expense of communication. In order to best facilitate the study of language and culture, the course should be taught primarily in the target language.
