**Matt** – **Academic Oversight** – reviewed all scores this month with Nick – see back of director's report for all notes. Some highlights:

☐ Academics and Culture was 4.3 which was the "low" score two years ago – 2.98 (highest you can get is 5.0)

☐ #5 out of ALL charter schools; top 15% in entire district.

☐ State Accountability Score — At 2.7, we are very close to a 3 (A) and some of our ESSR funds are going toward improving that.

Tiffany asked the question – how many do we think may have unrecognized disabilities?

Nick: 15 percent on an IEP; a group on the border who may qualify; we are full inclusion, although we are higher than the district average (of 10%) – once a parent or guardian says something that is when federal protection starts
