SCHOLARSHIP RULES

Southwest Cowboy Poets Association (SWCPA) consist of ranch and farm minded individuals who strive to preserve the western heritage. This partnership is committed to accomplish that goal with cowboy poetry and cowboy music. Offering scholarships to area students who share that goal is an effective instrument to insure that the cowboy heritage will be preserved. These scholarships are available to anyone who have a love for the western way of life and are committed to a higher level of knowledge. The members from SWCPA scholarship committee will select the scholarship winners.

SCHOLARSHIP RULES

1. Applicants must be high school seniors who are eligible to enroll and attend an institution of higher education or vocational/technical school or to college students who plan to continue their education at a college or vocational/technical school.
2. Applicant must be a legal U.S. resident, 21 years of age or less, and reside within the geographic boundaries of Texas, Oklahoma or New Mexico.
3. Each year, several \$600 scholarships will be awarded to area students who are involved with the ranch/farm lifestyles.
4. The recipient must complete the school year or semester with at least a 2.0 Grade Point Average.
5. The scholarships funds will be payable to the recipient immediately after the next semester is completed and upon delivery of grades to SWCPA scholarship committee. These scholarship funds are to be used at the sole discretion of the recipient.
6. The school chosen by the scholarship recipient must be an accredited college or technical school.
7. The attached Scholarship Application form must be completed and submitted to SWCPA no later than May 1, of the school year.
