Chronology of Events (May 1-24)

May 1, 2025 — Early Warning from the NDP

- **/u/Oracle_of_Mercia (NDP)** publishes a press release warning of growing radicalisation within the PPC. He criticizes their use of street marches led by MPs as a form of political performance, suggesting it undermines democratic norms and is intended to stoke unrest.

May 10, 2025 — The PPC Protests Begin

- **/u/RaymondI810 (PPC)** announces the party's plan to launch nationwide protests against the Conservative government. He pledges to lead rallies in Calgary, Vancouver, and other cities in coordination with Party Leader **/u/FreedomCanada2025**.
- **/u/FreedomCanada2025 (PPC)** travels to Alberta, decrying the Conservative Party's "betrayals," including failure to repeal Bill C-69 (which they call the "No New Pipelines Act") and refusal to pass a bill recognizing only two genders. He frames the protests as a fight against both the Conservatives and prior Liberal inaction.
- **/u/Xelqua391 (PPC)** announces she will join the protests, particularly in reaction to the CPC's refusal to debate Bill C-206, which she argues would have advanced Canadian energy independence.

May 11, 2025 — The First Wave of Demonstrations

- **/u/Unlucky_Kale_5342 (PPC)** issues a strong statement from Ottawa praising protestors and accusing the CPC of abandoning conservative values.
- **/u/Zetix026 (PPC)** publishes his reasons for joining the protests: defending Bill C-201 (on gender recognition) and Bill C-206 (on pipelines), and condemns CPC inaction.
- **/u/RaymondI810 (PPC)** leads a massive protest rally at Nose Hill Park in Calgary, condemns CPC's energy policy, and calls out Prime Minister **/u/Scribba25** and Deputy PM **/u/Cheeselover129**.
- **/u/FreedomCanada2025 (PPC)** hosts a large rally in Fort McMurray, framing the protest as a battle for energy jobs and "biological truth." In a post-rally Q&A, he draws a distinction from the 2022 Freedom Convoy by emphasizing the protest's regional and economic focus.
- **/u/Electrical_Cobbler27 (PPC)** leads a protest in Edmonton, slamming CPC betrayal and marching to the Edmonton Expo Centre.

May 12, 2025 — Reactions and Escalation

- **/u/Oracle_of_Mercia (NDP)** criticizes the protests again, claiming they are not genuine patriotism but provocation and a threat to civil peace.
- **/u/Raymond1810 (PPC)** addresses a crowd outside Rogers Arena in Vancouver, continuing criticism of the CPC's pipeline and gender policies.
- **/u/Mauricejc (Conservative, Foreign Affairs)** responds with a sharp critique of the PPC, accusing them of economic illiteracy and populist overreach. He asserts that the Conservatives are leading responsibly, while the PPC is engaged in “cleaver politics.”
- **/u/Cheeseloover129 (Conservative)** makes a surprise appearance at the Vancouver protest, defends CPC policy, and refutes PPC claims about C-206 and C-201.
- **/u/Raymond1810, /u/Xelqua391, and /u/Electrical_Cobbler27** hold a joint protest near the Port of Vancouver, each addressing crowds and calling for energy reform and federal accountability.

May 13, 2025 — Consolidation of Opposition

- **/u/Oracle_of_Mercia (NDP)** holds a community meeting at a pub in Vancouver, condemning the PPC's tactics as bullying and incitement.
- **/u/Xelqua391 (PPC)** uses the joint protest to question CPC transparency and pledges continued listening and accountability to her constituents.
- **/u/Electrical_Cobbler27 (PPC)** criticizes the CPC's energy infrastructure policy and frames pipelines as a “common sense” solution to economic malaise.

May 17, 2025 — PPC Momentum Moves East

- **/u/Zhuk236 (PPC)** launches protests in Quebec City, condemning the CPC-NDP “coalition” for economic stagnation, regulatory overreach, and betrayal of Quebec values. **/u/Zhuk236** then continued in Gaspé, criticizing federal inaction on fisheries and tourism.
- **/u/Zhuk236** concludes with a third protest in Montreal, focusing on the housing affordability crisis and calling for deregulation and reduced foreign speculation.

May 20, 2025 — Ontario Becomes the Focus

- **/u/FreedomCanada2025 (PPC)** announces a series of protests across Ontario, including stops in Ottawa and Barrie. He frames it as a response to inflation, the GET IT DONE Act, and Conservative tax policy.
- **May 21, 2025 — Ottawa Protest:** /u/FreedomCanada2025 leads a rally on Parliament Hill, citing public transit failures and government economic mismanagement. He also criticizes Independent MP /u/Trick_Bar_1439 as “elite and absent.”

May 23, 2025 — Barrie Becomes the New Flashpoint

- **/u/FreedomCanada2025** leads a protest in Barrie condemning tax hikes in the GET IT DONE Act and invoking cultural grievances. He alleges that the government is betraying “real Canadians.”
- **/u/Model-Wanuke (Liberal)** joins the protest, gives an impassioned speech about middle-class pain, and criticizes the removal of tax credits. He is photographed warmly greeting FreedomCanada2025.
- **/u/Mauricejc (Conservative Finance Minister)** delivers a detailed rebuttal, defending the GET IT DONE Act’s income tax cuts and fiscal logic, while accusing the opposition of spreading misinformation.

May 24, 2025 — The Narrative War Intensifies

- **/u/Oracle_of_Mercia (NDP)** posts a detailed fact-check of the PPC’s transit claims, noting that Ottawa’s LRT crisis stemmed from poor municipal-private project oversight, not federal interference.
- **/u/Cheeselover129 (Conservative)** appears on national news to denounce the PPC’s events as staged political theatre rather than real protests, and criticizes the PPC for lying and undermining democratic integrity.
- **/u/Zhuk236 (PPC)** joins the Barrie protest, echoing economic frustrations and branding the GET IT DONE Act as “Get Higher Taxes Done.”
- **/u/FreedomCanada2025 (PPC)** responds to the NDP, accusing them of incoherence and betrayal of their own base.
- **/u/Model-Wanuke (Liberal)** follows up, denouncing the NDP for siding with the Conservatives and defending his own attendance at the PPC-aligned protest as a matter of principle, not partisanship.
- **May 25: /u/alpal2214 (CPC)** condemns the “circus in Barrie,” accusing the PPC and Liberals of desperation and opportunistic alliance. /u/alpal2214 accused both the PPC and Liberals of abandoning their parliamentary duty in favour of media theatrics, calling them to return to Parliament and fulfill their democratic responsibilities.

The Status of Canon as of May 28, 2025

The People's Party of Canada has presented themselves as defenders of traditional conservative values, betrayed by a Conservative-Democratic Alliance.

The Conservative Government have rejected the bills of the People's Party of Canada as being poorly constructed or unviable, defending the GET IT DONE Act as delivering substantial income tax cuts and in managing inflation. They say that the protests are agitational and performative. Or so assumed.

The New Democratic Party positioned themselves as protectors of institutional norms and democratic integrity, denouncing the People's Party marches as radical, populist stunts; criticising both them and the Conservative for abandoning progressive policy and economic cohesion.

The Liberal Party, voiced particularly by the return of /u/Model-Wanuke, aligned the party's position with that of the public opposition towards the GET IT DONE Act, accusing the New Democratic Party of enabling right wing-governance.

The People's Party-led protests have become one of the largest grassroots political movements in r/CMHOC's history, with crowds spanning cities from Fort McMurray to Montreal.

Extensive coverage in national and regional press has been made regarding these protests, and their messaging of the People's Party is becoming increasingly well-received in shaping public perceptions over pipelines, taxations and gender identity.

While the bell tolls, the Conservative Government continues to push its legislative agenda through Parliament at a historical rate, framing the People's Party protests as being fringe and theatrical. The New Democratic Party warns the rising populism and anti-democratic tendencies may threaten Canada's democracy.

The People's Party have consolidated their base and attracted much public sympathy. Questions remain about whether this momentum will translate into institutional influence or electoral gain.

The wave of protests represents the crystallization of a populist discontent amid a shifting political landscape. As Ottawa faces fiscal and regulatory reform, the critics rally in the numbers against them in the streets, the country appears locked in a widening ideological divide between conservatism and populism.
