

How to Make a Report of Bullying

Students/parents have the ability to file an online or offline report of bullying. Students are informed at the beginning of school, as well as periodically during the school year, how to file a report of bullying. Here's a closer look at the two:

1. Offline (in person)

- Students can report to their teacher (in person or written) or other staff members in the building.
- Students can report directly to the Assistant Principal or Counselor. This exact
 procedure varies from campus to campus, but school officials do make students
 aware of the process. Campuses have the "DISD Bullying/Harassment Report"
 form. These can usually be found in the administrator's and/or school counselor's
 office.
- Students are encouraged to report to an adult at school and home.

2. Online (anonymous)

- STOP!T App Students are given a code for their campus to download the app. Once downloaded, follow prompts.
- STOP!T Web Based click the icon found on campus websites and follow prompts.
- Once the online report is submitted, it will be sent to the campus administrators to begin the investigation process.
- Campus administrators will contact the students and parents involved in the report.
- Interim steps will be taken to ensure safety of the students involved while the investigation is taking place.
- Once the investigation and a plan of action have been determined, the investigator will inform all parties involved of the findings.
- Students and parents are encouraged to report all forms of bullying or retaliation to the staff member conducting the investigation.
