Student Concerns

Verona High School prides itself on working with our students to make our school a better place. If a student has a concern that they feel impacts the school, they should follow the procedure listed below. While our staff is always available to listen to any student concern, this procedure provides an additional opportunity to be heard. Our student government serves as a coordinating council between our students, faculty and administration. We feel that student concerns should first be addressed at the student government level.

All students have the right and ability to formally voice their concerns to the Student Government. Please follow the procedure below:

- 1. A student must communicate the concern in writing to the student council delegate in their grade level, indicating the specific nature of the concern and the desired action.
- 2. A meeting between the student who wrote the concern and the student council will be held. The concerned student must attend the meeting.
- 3. The student council will determine the appropriate committee to assign the concern to, if warranted.
- 4. The assigned committee will discuss the concern and meet with the student within 10 school days.
- 5. Based on the committee's findings, the student council can then act on the committee recommendations, request further information, or take no action, which means the matter will no longer be considered.
