

Grandparent Interview

Summary and Notes

This is the assignment where you go and talk to your grandma or grandpa and ask your questions. This is best done in person, but if that's not possible you can do the interview over the phone or video conferencing software (LINE, Hangouts, etc.) You cannot email or text your questions.

Before the Interview

Make sure you **have your questions ready** before the interview. Make sure you have prepared everything you need for the interview as well. To be sure you are ready, complete the checklist of things to **prepare** below.

- ☐ Printed sheet of your interview questions
- ☐ Pen and paper
- ☐ A smartphone or other device to record the interview
- ☐ At least one hour of free time to give your grandparent enough time to give you the information you need

During the Interview

While you are interviewing you should have pen and paper and **take notes**. It is also a good idea to use your phone or other device to **record the interview** as well so you can go back and review it later. Make sure you ask your grandparent if it is ok to record first. Remember to be polite and respectful. Listen, don't interrupt, and ask follow-up questions if necessary.

After the Interview

Your grandparent most likely didn't answer your questions in English. It is time to look through your notes and your recording of the interview and **write a summary** of the information in English in the space below. This will be used to support your final proposal at the end of the project.
