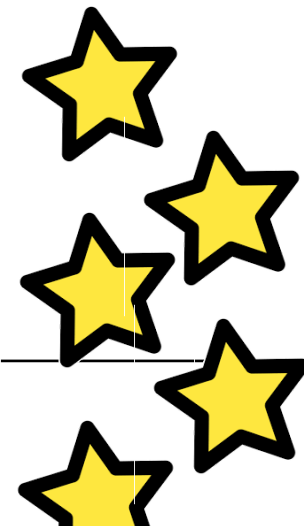

How long did the riot last?	3 days		One year	
What happened during the riot?	Cars were overturned and set on fire, Europeans and Eurasians were attacked, 18 people had been killed and 173 were injured.		The dismissed people blocked the bus gates preventing any buses from leaving. Police was then called to intervene but failed. Students from Chinese-medium schools came to help. This riot lead to 4 people dead and 31 injured.
