Mini-Lesson [10 min]	What is Risk? Review a practice scenario to introduce concept of risk and then define the three types of risk with investment	Slides
Guided Practice [10 min]	Conservative, Moderate or Speculative risk? As a class, consider three scenarios and determine which level of risk it presents	Slides
OPTIONAL: Guided/Independent Practice [10 min]	To risk or not to risk? Students work through different scenarios on the handout to decide if the level of risk for the individual person. (risk tolerance in personal)	Handout
Mini-Lesson [10 min]	What is Diversification? Introduce students to what diversification means and review some examples	Slides
Guided Practice [15+ min]	Time to research: As a team, start researching industries students are interested in by using financial search engines	Slides, online financial search engines (this can be done on teacher computer
