COMPETITION THEME

"Role of Judiciary in Upholding Social, Economic and Political Justice"

ABOUT THE COMPETITION

The Centre for Constitutional Law and Human Rights, School of Law, Bennett University, invites law students across India to participate in the Constitutional Amendment Drafting Competition during the Constitutional Week Celebrations. This competition provides a unique platform for budding legal minds to engage with constitutional provisions and propose meaningful reforms that strengthen the judiciary's role in delivering social, economic, and political justice to all citizens.

COMPETITION PROPOSITION

Assume yourself to be a member of Parliament for a day with the power to draft and propose **ONE constitutional amendment to Article 14, Article 32, OR Article 39A** of the Indian Constitution.

This amendment may include any kind of:

- **Addition** to the existing provision
- **Alteration** of existing language
- **Omission** of certain clauses

The Chosen Articles and Their Significance:

Article 14 - Equality before Law and Equal Protection of Laws

The foundational principle ensuring that the State shall not deny any person equality before the law or equal protection of laws within the territory of India. This article forms the bedrock of social and political justice.

Article 32 - Right to Constitutional Remedies

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar described this as the "heart and soul" of the Constitution. It empowers the Supreme Court to issue writs for the enforcement of fundamental rights, making the judiciary the ultimate guardian of constitutional justice.

Article 39A - Equal Justice and Free Legal Aid

A Directive Principle that mandates the State to secure equal justice and provide free legal aid to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities.

Participants are required to draft a well-reasoned amendment proposal explaining how their proposed change will strengthen the judiciary's role in upholding social, economic, and political justice in contemporary India.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

Stage 1: Draft Submission

All registered participants must submit their draft proposals by **22nd November 2025, 11:59 PM**. Submissions will be evaluated by a distinguished Panel of Judges based on the judging criteria mentioned below.

Stage 2: Oral Pleading Rounds (Final Round)

The **TOP 10 TEAMS/INDIVIDUALS** will be shortlisted based on their draft submissions and invited to present their proposals orally before the Panel of Judges on **25th November 2025**. The oral rounds will be conducted via the **ZOOM platform**.

During the oral presentation, participants must:

- Present their amendment proposal
- Argue why the chosen article requires amendment
- Defend their position through constitutional reasoning
- Respond to questions from the judges

ARGUMENT FRAMEWORK

Participants must address the following aspects in their draft and oral presentation:

1. RATIONALE FOR AMENDMENT

- Why does the chosen article (14, 32, or 39A) require amendment?
- What are the current gaps, ambiguities, or limitations in the existing provision?
- What contemporary challenges necessitate this constitutional reform?
- How is the current provision inadequate in addressing issues of social, economic, or political justice?

2. BASIS FOR AMENDMENT

- Constitutional foundations supporting your amendment
- Judicial precedents demonstrating gaps in the current provision
- Socio-legal research, reports, and empirical data highlighting justice delivery issues
- Comparative constitutional analysis (if applicable)
- Statistical evidence of access to justice barriers or inequality

3. IMPACT ASSESSMENT - ROLE OF JUDICIARY

- How will this amendment enhance the judiciary's capacity to deliver social, economic, and political justice?
- What specific problems in the justice delivery system will it address?
- Who are the marginalized or vulnerable groups that will benefit?
- How will this amendment improve access to justice, judicial accountability, or judicial efficiency?

- Why is this amendment necessary in the current Indian socio-economic and political context?

4. CONSTITUTIONAL VALIDITY

- How does your amendment align with the Basic Structure Doctrine?
- Does it enhance or restrict fundamental rights?
- What is its relationship with other constitutional provisions?
- How does it balance judicial independence with accountability?

IMPORTANT: You shall insert **ONLY ONE Amendment** to **ONLY ONE Article** of the Constitution (either Article 14, Article 32, OR Article 39A).

JUDGEMENT CRITERIA

The draft submissions and oral presentations shall be evaluated on the following parameters:

Evaluation Guidelines:

- **Utility for Society:** Practical impact on justice delivery, relevance to contemporary challenges in social/economic/political justice, potential to address real barriers in accessing justice, and strengthening the judiciary's constitutional role
- **Novelty and Innovation:** Originality of thought, creative legal reasoning, fresh perspectives on judicial reform, and innovative solutions to systemic issues
- **Strength of Arguments:** Legal soundness, constitutional backing, effective use of precedents, empirical evidence, and persuasive reasoning connecting the amendment to the theme of judiciary's role in upholding justice

ELIGIBILITY

The Competition is open to students currently pursuing their bachelor's degree in law:

- **3-Year LLB course, OR**
- **5-Year LLB course**

from any recognized university/college/school of law in India.

TEAM COMPOSITION

- Participants may participate **individually** or in a **team of 2 members**
- Each team/individual will be assigned a unique **Team Code** upon registration
- All correspondence will be conducted using the Team Code to maintain anonymity

WORD LIMIT

- **Minimum:** 1,000 words
- **Maximum:** 3,000 words

(Footnotes, headings, and bibliography are excluded from the word count)

FORMATTING GUIDELINES

Document Format:

- All drafts must be submitted in **BOTH** formats:
 - Microsoft Word Document (.doc/.docx)
 - PDF Format (.pdf)
- Each participant must submit **2 files** (one Word document and one PDF)

Text Formatting:

- **Body Text:** Times New Roman, Font Size 12, Line Spacing 1.5, Justified alignment
- **Headings:** Times New Roman (font size may vary as per participant's choice for better readability)
- **Footnotes:** Times New Roman, Font Size 10, Single line spacing, Justified alignment
- **Page Margins:** 1 inch on all sides (standard)

- **Page Numbers:** Bottom centre

Citation Style:

- All authorities, cases, statutes, and sources must be cited as per the **20th Edition of The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation**
- Proper footnoting is mandatory

Annexures (Optional):

If participants wish to submit supporting materials such as:

- Reports and research papers
- Commentaries and legal opinions
- News clippings and media articles
- Statistical data and charts
- Photographs or diagrams

A **Compendium of Annexures** must be prepared and submitted along with the main draft.

- o Ability to articulate arguments and conclusion- 10 marks

2. A warning bell will ring at 2.5 minute and then a final call will be made at 5 minutes.
3. No external materials or aids will be allowed during the debate preparation or delivery.
4. Marks would be deducted for aiding through Mobile phones or papers.
5. The decision of the judge will be final and binding to all participants. The judge may question the participants after the end of their debate.
6. The participant can either speak in English or Hindi. Switching the medium of language while speaking is strictly prohibited.
7. Cross questioning by other fellow participants is not allowed.
8. Misconduct, including disrespect toward judges or fellow participants, will lead to disqualification and deduction.

- **Use of Space:** Balance the elements effectively to create a visually pleasing composition within the given space.
- **Copyright and Ethics:** If using images or content from external sources, ensure you have the right permissions and give proper credit to the creators.
- **Proofread and Review:** Before submission, check the slogan for spelling and grammar errors, and review the overall design for any mistakes or improvements.
- **Time limit:** Participants will have 60 minutes to complete both the poster and the slogan.

Awards and Prizes:
