Policy Statement

The school uniform of St John Bosco Catholic Primary School, Engadine is unique and clearly identifies which school the students attend. The school uniform gives the students a sense of belonging to the St John Bosco community. It is the school's policy that students attending St John Bosco Catholic Primary School, Engadine wear the full school uniform with pride. Students are permitted to wear the full sports uniform on the designated sports day. Parents support this policy by ensuring their child is wearing the correct uniform.

Uniform Procedures

1.1 The new school is as follows and all students are to wear their uniform in a neat and tidy manner at all times

(To be worn tucked in)
- Pants** Navy blue

- Shirt** White long sleeve shirt with navy buttons
- Tunic OR** Navy blue with crest
- Pants** Navy blue
- Socks** Navy blue socks or navy blue stockings
- Shoes** Black leather school shoes

Hats are worn every day.

K-6 - wide brimmed hat or royal blue baseball cap

Hats are available for purchase from the school canteen.

School Bag

St John Bosco branded backpacks are compulsory for all students in K-6. St John Bosco branded backpacks can be purchased from the school office. Attaching novelty keyrings is one way to help your child identify their bag.

2.0

All students are required to wear the school hat to and from school, at recess and lunchtime, to protect them from the harmful effects of the sun. Hats with the school logo on them fulfil the requirements of the Australian Cancer Council and these can be purchased at the school canteen.

The school has a 'No Hat, No Play Policy', whereby students without a hat will be restricted to the shaded areas outside the school library.

3.0

Students are required to follow the uniform expectations below:

- Students wear their uniform in a neat and tidy fashion. Shirts are to be tucked in when walking to, from and in class (old uniform).
- Jewellery is to be limited to studs and sleepers in each ear and a watch. The wearing of expensive jewellery or watches is discouraged. If a chain or necklace is worn to school, it must remain under the uniform out of sight at all times. No other items of jewellery are permitted to be worn to school.
- Girls with hair longer than their shoulders are required to have it tied back with a ribbon or scrunchie in the appropriate school colours. Headbands should also be in the proper school colours.
- Boys are to have an appropriate haircut. Shaved patterns are not permitted, and hair is to be no longer than the collar without having the hair tied back.
- Students are not permitted to dye or bleach their hair. It is to be kept in its natural colour. No student is permitted to have coloured hair extensions/accessories in their hair or severe haircuts/styles.
- Hats are not to have any graffiti or stickers on them, and must be in good repair.
- Joggers should only be worn on designated sport days. Joggers should be predominantly white. No coloured joggers or socks below the ankle are permitted.
- School shoes should be black leather with laces or velcro. Black joggers should not be worn with the school uniform.
- School socks should be ankle socks only

4.0 Procedure to follow up on a uniform breach

1. Students who have a valid reason for not wearing the school uniform are asked to communicate this to their class teacher via a note from their parents. If students do not have a note, they are asked to bring one the next day.
2. If the student still has the uniform breach the next day and does not have a note, they will receive a uniform breach recorded as a Chronicle on Compass by the class teacher. The chronicle will be communicated to the parents via an email asking parents to rectify the breach as soon as possible or state when the breach will be rectified.
3. Class teacher is to follow up with the parent if they have not rectified the breach within one week.

4.1 Procedure to follow up on a Sports uniform breach

1. Students who have a valid reason for not wearing the school sports uniform are asked to communicate this to the RFF teachers via a note from their parents.
2. If the student does not present a note, they will receive a sports uniform breach recorded as a Chronicle on Compass by the first RFF teacher the student has.
3. The RFF teacher who recorded this on Compass will inform the other RFF teachers and the classroom teacher that a Chronicle has been written.
