#### John Read Middle School Receives Grant to Launch Robotics Club

John Read Middle School is excited to announce it has received a \$1,557 grant to launch a new FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Challenge robotics club as part of the school's growing STEM curriculum. The club, which will operate under the guidance of STEM teacher Mandy McCubbin, will meet after school on Wednesdays and is open to 6th - 8th grade students. The program aims to inspire innovation, teamwork, and hands-on learning in robotics, with an emphasis on inclusivity and encouraging more girls to explore STEM. This initiative marks the beginning of an exciting new chapter in JRMS's commitment to preparing students for the careers of the future through engaging, real-world learning opportunities.
