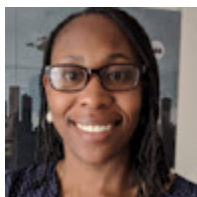

Dean's Office FAQ:

Who do I go to if I or someone I know is being bullied or harassed?

- If you or someone you know of being bullied or harassed, please go to the Dean's Office to speak to Mr. White or Ms. Velasquez.

What happens after I report a bullying or harassment issue?

- The dean's office will complete a thorough investigation of the suspected bullying or harassment. In some cases, the School Resource Officer or administration will be involved.

At what point, is the School Resource Officer brought into a bullying or harassment situation?

- The School Resource Officer is brought into these situations when a situation potentially involves a legal matter.

If I report that I am being bullied or harassed, will my parents be notified?

- Yes. Your parents will be notified.

If I report that someone else is being bullied or harassed, will that information be shared with the alleged victim?

- No. We keep these situations confidential and protect the privacy of our students.

What do I do if I suspect that theft has occurred?

- If you suspect that theft has occurred, please access the Dean's Office to make a report to one of the deans, or Detective Chiesa, School Resource Officer.

Where do I go if I have lost or misplaced a personal item?

- If you have lost or misplaced an item, and suspect your item is in lost and found, please see Mrs. Pyle, Administration Assistant to the Dean's Office.

How do I apply for a parking spot?

- If you would like to apply for a parking spot, see Mrs. Pyle in the Dean's Office. Mrs. Pyle will send you an application to complete. Once completed, send the application back to Mrs. Pyle and she will send itAdm to one of the deans for review and final approval.

Who do I go to to report technology issues?

- If you are experiencing technology issues, you can bring these concerns to the Dean's Office and ask to speak with one of the deans. You can also access the Tech Help Desk located inside the Library (LRC) doors.
