



Ground/Work Scholarship Considerations

UPDATE: Scholarship spaces have been filled for Cohort 2 of Ground/Work.

Studio Magic Hour holds two spots in this program for practitioners seeking scholarships. Participants who receive these full scholarships will not need to make any financial investment to fully participate in the program.

Please only apply for a scholarship if financial investment (based on our pricing structure) is truly not feasible for you. If you are on staff at a company/organization, we strongly encourage you to request professional development funds to support you in paying for this course. If that is not an option, we ask that you consider the following questions, which are informed by the [National Equity Project's Sliding Scale](#), before seeking a scholarship:

- Are you/your family homeowners or landowners?
- Are your bills or credit cards on autopay?
- Can you access and afford healthcare/health insurance?
- Do you have zero to no debt?
- Do you have disposable income?
- Do you have a safety net of "financially stable" or wealthy family and friends?
- Do you have U.S. Citizenship?
- Does your income only support you?
- Have/will you inherit money or property?
- Have you (or could you have) attended college/grad school?

If you answered "yes" to more questions than "no", we encourage you to leave scholarship opportunities to practitioners with less financial privilege and/or access to resources.

Scholarships will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis.
