Nicole Carr is a veteran award-winning journalist and Visiting Assistant Professor of journalism at Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA.

Carr's investigative work in local television and at ProPublica has earned four Emmys, a team coverage Murrow, recognition from the Associated Press, a Sidney award, and multiple citations for "must-read" long-form narratives.

This work was largely centered on race, democracy, education-from the Big election lie to the parental rights and anti-DEI movements.

Carr joined Morehouse College in 2021 where she's been developing the social justice track for its new journalism major, including a course on the history of the Black press. Earlier this year, Carr won top honors in Opinion/Op-Ed from the American Society for Journalists and Authors.

The winning piece, written in 2024 for *The Emancipator*, is entitled 'The Black press democratized America."

Carr's forthcoming book (June 2026), The Price of Exclusion: The Pursuit of Healthcare in a Segregated Nation is part ancestral journey and part historical reparation.

It relies heavily on untouched archives and pages of the historic Black press to explore racism, medical education and the plight of Black physicians in America and abroad.
