The scholarship is open to eligible high school juniors at your school site **that have plans to enroll full-time in an accredited four-year university in the United States upon graduating high school.** Successful candidates will be selected on the basis of academic achievement (3.0 GPA minimum requirement), demonstrated financial need and a proven commitment to community service.
