Digital Wellbeing

It's not quite all doom and gloom for library patrons. While physical branches may have shut down, many libraries still offer a wealth of digital content for those who have internet access elsewhere. Card holders can take advantage of ebook loans and streaming programs offered by their local libraries. In general, libraries have also become much more forgiving about item return dates and library card expirations.

Some libraries have started offering even more robust online offerings, from upping the allotment of streaming media rentals to hosting online reading sessions. On March 24, the Internet Archive announced it was creating a "National Emergency Library" by suspending wait lists for the 1.4 million books in its digital lending library. The


organization says the suspension will remain in place until June 30, or the end of the US national emergency, whichever is later.

"We cannot create a sense of normalcy for them," Salazar says. "But we can use this new reality to offer something different. That's what we're working on. Many of us are challenged, but we're coming up with good, creative ideas."


What We Talk About When We Talk About Love

Mr. Jim In the Garden of Beasts:
Love, Terror, and an American Family in Hitler's Berlin

There have been a lot of books written about the slave experience in the Americas but here is a story with some different content. Esi Edugyan's third novel Washington Black is about a young slave on a plantation in the Barbados who is released from his horrible owner to serve an independent scientist. He quickly develops skills that make him an invaluable contributor to the scientific world and leads him to far-flung adventures that takes him to Virginia, the north pole, Nova Scotia, England and other places. Although he does not remain a slave, varying degrees of racism are encountered everywhere he goes and affects all aspects of his life.

The novel is a mixture of adventure, history, social commentary and philosophy. It doesn't just stay with the cliches of the slave experience but opens the reader up to a world full of contradictions and grey areas that only a well-researched and incredibly intelligent author could devise.

Student Computers

The Faculty and Administration believe technology is a powerful and integral part of the TCIS instructional program. While there are many good computers on the market, please understand that the TCIS High School requires MacBooks for all students.

1) **TCIS High School** is a MacBook one-to-one school - MacBooks are required for all grade 9 through 12 students



2) TCIS Middle School

- a) MacBooks are recommended for grades 7 & 8 students.
 - i) A Chromebook is acceptable (remember a MacBook is required for grades 9-12)
- b) School owned Chromebooks are provided for grades 5 & 6 students.
- c) All students in Grades 5-8 need access to a computer at their home. Students will be using Google Classroom and various websites for school work. We do recommend a laptop but any computer for home use is fine. iPads and tables are acceptable but have some limitations. Windows-based computers are fine for home use as well but are not allowed on the school network.

3) TCIS Elementary School

a) School owned technology is provided for elementary students


