

## **SD Catholic Religion Standards**

#### Overview:

The Six Tasks of Catechesis provide the framework for the PreK -8 Religion Standards developed initially by the Office for Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of Seattle and then, with permission, adapted for use by the Office for Schools in the Diocese of San Diego. The Six Tasks of Catechesis: Knowledge of the Faith; Liturgical Education; Moral Formation; Teaching to Pray; Education for the Life of the Church; and the Church's Missionary Life are distinct and complementary. Each task helps us deepen our personal relationship with Christ. Knowing Jesus calls us to celebrate this relationship and also reminds us of the need for ongoing conversion, which leads to prayer, recognizing the needs of others, and realizing how we are called to share the Good News through word and deed.

#### Prioritized standards:

Prioritized standards are learning goals that have been identified as most essential to a particular grade level, content area, or course. Ideally, teachers at the school or district level collaborate to determine which standards to prioritize. (Marzano, 2014)

#### **Background:**

In the 2018-2019 school year, the North County Cluster worked collaboratively to identify prioritized standards for each task in every grade level. These prioritized standards were then reviewed by the Curriculum Leadership Team and the Office for Schools. When reviewing all of the standards, teams focused on leverage, endurance, grade-level alignment, and readiness when determining if a standard should be considered a prioritized standard. Teachers are responsible for ensuring all standards are learned by students; however, emphasis is to be placed on the identified prioritized standards.
