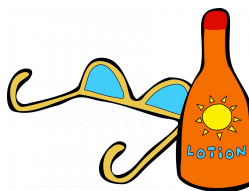

## Summer Reading Challenge Incoming 5th grade

*Complete one square for each month (June, July & August)-- then color each square to create a tic-toe-toe pattern (3 in a row.) The pattern can be vertical, horizontal or diagonal. This handout (and activities) will earn you a special award and you will participate in a reward celebration! (Information about how to turn the work in & the reward is TBD.)*

Read a fiction or nonfiction book. Design a character "webpage." (It can be on paper or a real website, such as Google Sites.) Include a picture of the character, the character's likes and dislikes and something he/she might write about him or herself.	Read a book that's been made into a movie. Using a Venn Diagram, compare and contrast the book and the movie. Read a fiction or nonfiction book. Create an advertisement about your book. Try to convince people to read the book. Get creative!
Read a <u>historical fiction</u> book. Draw a picture illustrating the <u>setting</u> . For book ideas, go to this link: <a href="#">Historical Fiction Book Ideas</a> Write down the titles you are interested in, then go to Overdrive to see if the public library has them available: <a href="#">Overdrive (Los Angeles Public Library)</a>	<u>With parents' permission</u> , find 4 interesting pictures on the following Instagram accounts (@nasa, @sandiegozoo, @natgeo, @yellowstonenps) and write captions for each picture (2 or more sentences for each caption.)	Read your best friend's favorite book. Then, Zoom (or Facetime, etc.) your friend and discuss what you both liked and disliked about the story.
Read a book based on a true story. Then after reading the story, email the author 2 questions about the book.	Read a biography. Draw a "selfie" of you and the person the book was about on a piece of paper. Write 3-5 sentences about what you learned about the person.	Read a book (that you haven't read before) that is part of a series. Write why or why not you would read another book in the series (at least 3-5 sentences.)
