




fresh ink 2021

Voices from Aotearoa reflecting on Covid-19



This diverse collection of work called ***fresh ink*** is the third anthology to be published by Cloud Ink Press. ***fresh ink 2021*** explores a theme of Covid-19 and consists of stories, essays, poetry, flash fiction and artwork from 46 different contributors. Although the pandemic has loomed so large in our lives over the past months, the writing in this collection is by no means all doom and gloom or even besotted by the virus. There is laughter, sorrow and emotion, some amazing stories and positivity in unusual circumstances.

Perhaps even more so than in the previous two collections – *fresh ink 2017* and *fresh ink 2019*, the authors and artists in this anthology have come from far and wide, all over New Zealand from Otago to Northland and one New Zealand writer, Tom Baragwanath (the 2021 winner of the Michael Gifkin's prize) is based in Paris. There are well-respected authors like Siobhan Harvey, as well as plenty of new writers whose work appears for the first time. The work in this anthology was chosen by editor Tina Shaw from numerous submissions.

The stories are not a 'what-happened-to-me-during-lockdown' as much as an inspiration that life continues to be different, varied and individual. The inspiration from nature in much of the poetry ties in well with the kākāpō on the front cover. A percentage of proceeds from the book will get donated to the Department of Conservation Kākāpō Recovery Programme.

The cover artwork was designed by Suzanne Day, a graphic artist who also happens to be a Master of Creative Writing graduate. She designed the covers for the previous anthologies, each of which depicts an endangered New Zealand bird. Her own manifesto reflects that of ***fresh ink***, 'Every project is a magical new adventure: a journey into the mysteries of the universe and the co-creation of a new reality.'

fresh ink 2021 will be launched in September and is available from all good New Zealand bookshops from 25 September 2021. Review copies are available from the publisher, Cloud Ink Press.
