SCHOLARSHIPS

- <u>Coolidge Scholarship</u> FOR GRADE 11 STUDENTS The Coolidge Scholarship is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that recipients may use for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States. Any high school junior who plans to enroll in college in the fall of 2025 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (current high school seniors are not eligible to apply). Winners may use the scholarship to pursue any academic major. **DEADLINE: 8:00 p.m. on January 18, 2024**
- Pearls of Hope Scholarship In partnership with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Xi Sigma Omega chapter, this scholarship has distributed over \$229,000 in scholarships during the chapter's 40 years of existence. Scholarship winners exemplify the values of community service, entrepreneurship and social action, and pursuit of higher education. To be eligible for these scholarships, students must be high school seniors and reside in Montgomery County and/or attend a Montgomery County Public School. DEADLINE: MIDNIGHT ON FEBRUARY 29, 2024 Contact POHCFScholarship@gmail.com with questions.
- <u>Team DC LGBTQ+ Student Athlete Scholarship</u> The Team DC Student Athlete Scholarship provides up to \$2,000 of financial support to offset the cost of education expenses. Scholarships are awarded to self-identified LGBTQ+ student athletes who have contributed to the sport in which they participate and enhanced the perception of the LGBTQ+ community as a result of their contributions and involvement. **DEADLINE: MARCH 1, 2024**<u>APPLICATION | REQUIREMENTS</u>
- Montgomery College Board of Trustees Scholarship is a full scholarship for graduating high school seniors that will cover the cost of up to 15 credits per semester at the county rate for the first year and may be renewable for a second year. Students must be admitted to MC before they can access the online scholarship application. Once the student has been admitted and has set up their MyMC account, they will be able to complete the scholarship application using their MC login. Please note that students can complete the online scholarship application and submit the required essays and transcript with this application; however, the letter of recommendation must be emailed directly to botscholarships@montgomerycollege.edu. Transcripts must include the applicant's first semester grades. Students can complete the application now and send a transcript with their first semester grades as soon as they become available. Transcripts should be emailed to botscholarships@montgomerycollege.edu (an unofficial transcript is acceptable). The priority deadline is March 1st, but applications will be accepted through May 1st. Students who submit a completed application by the

priority deadline will be notified of a decision by April 15th. Late applicants will be notified of a decision by May 15th. For more information, visit www.montgomerycollege.edu/scholarships.

Apartment Maintenance Technician Class MCPS would like to open a class for students to earn certification as an Apartment Maintenance Technician. The class would be open to 11th grade students and held on weeknights starting in February. The expectation is that students who complete the class and gain the credential would be planning to complete an apprenticeship as an Apartment Maintenance Technician during the summer of their junior year and senior years. Apprentices gain industry certification and earn high school credit while completing a minimum of 480 paid hours at least at minimum wage over a school year. ACES Program and Application Open for 10th Graders Class of 2026 10th graders, the ACES application is available. Review this information below to see if ACES is a good fit for you. ACES is a FREE college and career preparatory program hosted at Magruder High School. ACES Coordinator Ms. Danielle Jordan helps students understand how to attend and afford college. Email or stop by Ms. Jordan's office in the second floor science B hallway. Visit www.acesmontgomery.org for more information. Students eligible for the program include first generation college, low-income households, students with an IEP, 504 plan and/or EML plan. The ACES application closes on January 12, 2024.

Sign up to take the ASVAB at Magruder High School in January or April! ASVAB is a career exploration tool for any student in grades 10-12 who wants to take it. ASVAB is a program that helps students learn about their skills and interests, identify potential occupations, and discover all the pathways to career-field entry. While the Department of Defense initially introduced the ASVAB as a predictor of trainability in military occupations, the test results showed applicability to ALL civilian and military career fields. Every ASVAB participant receives scores used to guide career exploration on asvabprogram.com, and students in grades 11 and 12 do also receive an AFQT score that can be used for enlistment if they choose.

• <u>Hungry Hank Cat Foodbank</u> ONGOING | Got cat food? The Montgomery County Community Cat Coalition is a non-profit, all volunteer organization which works to find humane and effective solutions to help community cats (outside cats living in colonies managed by caretakers). One project is to collect and distribute cat food to community cat colony caretakers on a quarterly basis. All food distributed is donated or bought with donated funds. Volunteers are needed to collect cat food from retail stores or to hold cat food drives at their school, church, etc. Volunteers are also welcome to help on the day of the cat food distribution to the colony caretakers.

- Meal Providers for Interfaith Works Women's Shelter at Crabbs Branch ONGOING | The Interfaith Works Women's Center at Crabbs Branch provides short-term, emergency shelter services to adult women. In addition to temporary shelter, the IW Women's Center also provides case management services to each client. These services connect clients to other community resources, such as primary medical care, legal services, psychiatric services, permanent housing services, and vocational services. Volunteers are needed to prepare meals for the 38 clients at the IW Women's Center, located at 16911 Crabbs Branch Way, Derwood, MD 20855.
- Youth Tutor (In Person) School and Community Youth Services ONGOING | The Youth Tutor will provide direction, support, and academic guidance to elementary through high school students in the School and Community Youth Services program of Sheppard Pratt (formerly Family Services, Inc.). Tutoring will take place on a one-to-one basis with assignments and reinforcement of subject areas provided as requested by the student. The School and Community Youth Services tutoring program has been matching students from their programs with tutors for over 28 years.
- <u>Health Presentation Language Translator</u> ONGOING | Circle of Rights Inc. is looking for language translators to translate English presentations on Heart Disease and Stroke to be presented in alternate languages to other communities. Some of these languages include (in no particular order): Gujarati, Urdu, Spanish. The presentation is found on Canva. Students will earn 10 SSL hours for successful completion of this task.
