The Cashton School District is inviting all students who live within its boundaries or who attend under open enrollment to participate in a wide variety of exciting classes designed to meet the diverse needs and interests of students of all ages and abilities to provide them with many opportunities to combine learning and fun. All students are encouraged to take advantage of this great opportunity to continue learning all year. Teachers are definitely able to see positive results for students who participate in the summer school program. Please seriously consider providing this opportunity for your child(ren).

Attached, you will find a list and description of the classes we are offering this year. Students are invited to take as many classes as they wish absolutely **free of charge**, with the exception of Golf where scholarships can be awarded if there is need or interest. Classes require students to be ready to explore and learn! Once students sign up for classes, they will be encouraged to attend each day.

Bus service will not be provided for the summer classes. Carpooling with friends and neighbors will allow more students to take advantage of this opportunity. Shorter classes are scheduled back to back on the same day to reduce the number of trips to and from town while enabling students to participate in multiple valuable learning opportunities.

Breakfast and lunch will be available for purchase for all students and will be free for those students who qualify. It will be offered in the elementary cafeteria each weekday June 16-June 27 and August 4-15 from 7:30-8:15, and 11:45-12:15. A free lunch will be available to everyone from 11:45-12:15 in the lobby of the elementary school and will be provided by members of the Cashton Community, July 7-25.

Entering Grades 5K

Focus: Students will develop social and academic language and vocabulary through rich literature and thematic play. Students will practice asking questions, participating in class discussions and describing their play. Students will also have opportunities to play with words to develop phonemic awareness and vocabulary. The focus of this course is addressed by Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standard III C.

Format: Specific academic and social vocabulary and skills will be directly taught with opportunities to practice vocabulary through age-appropriate literacy activities. Students will share about their experiences in a closure activity, incorporating some of the new vocabulary to support oral language development. Teachers will provide opportunities for peer interactions, structured group academic discussions, as well as 1-1 conferencing with a teacher.
