Final Exam: You will write a 5 paragraph literary analysis essay in which you will discuss how the author, Luis Rodriguez, uses various **literary devices** to convey a **theme** in the poem, “The Wanton Life.”

Theme: The overall message or purpose of the story. The theme teaches the readers a lesson regarding society or the human condition. The theme is a big idea, but it must be specific enough to support in an organized, clear argument.
