

Daughters of Mary School Code of Conduct



Dear parents, this is the code of conduct that will accompany your child throughout the school year. We ask you to go through it with your child, so that you are fully aware of the behavior expected at our school, and of the possible sanctions if these are not respected. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

The 4 laws :

1. **Physical or verbal violence is forbidden**
2. **Any lack of respect is punished**
3. **All materials must be respected**
4. **All outings are forbidden without authorization**

We rally around these 4 laws, which form the basis of our identity and shared values. All our rules are based on them.

Why do schools have rules?

- Our school brings together many children and adults. We are a group.
- Rules protect the group and set limits.
- Rules help us to live together better.
- You need to be aware of these rules, understand what they mean, respect them and behave accordingly.
- Adults will recognize your efforts.
- If you break one or more of our rules, you'll have to accept the consequences.
- Penalties will be proportionate to your age and to the seriousness and repetition of the offence.

Intervention according to severity and repetition

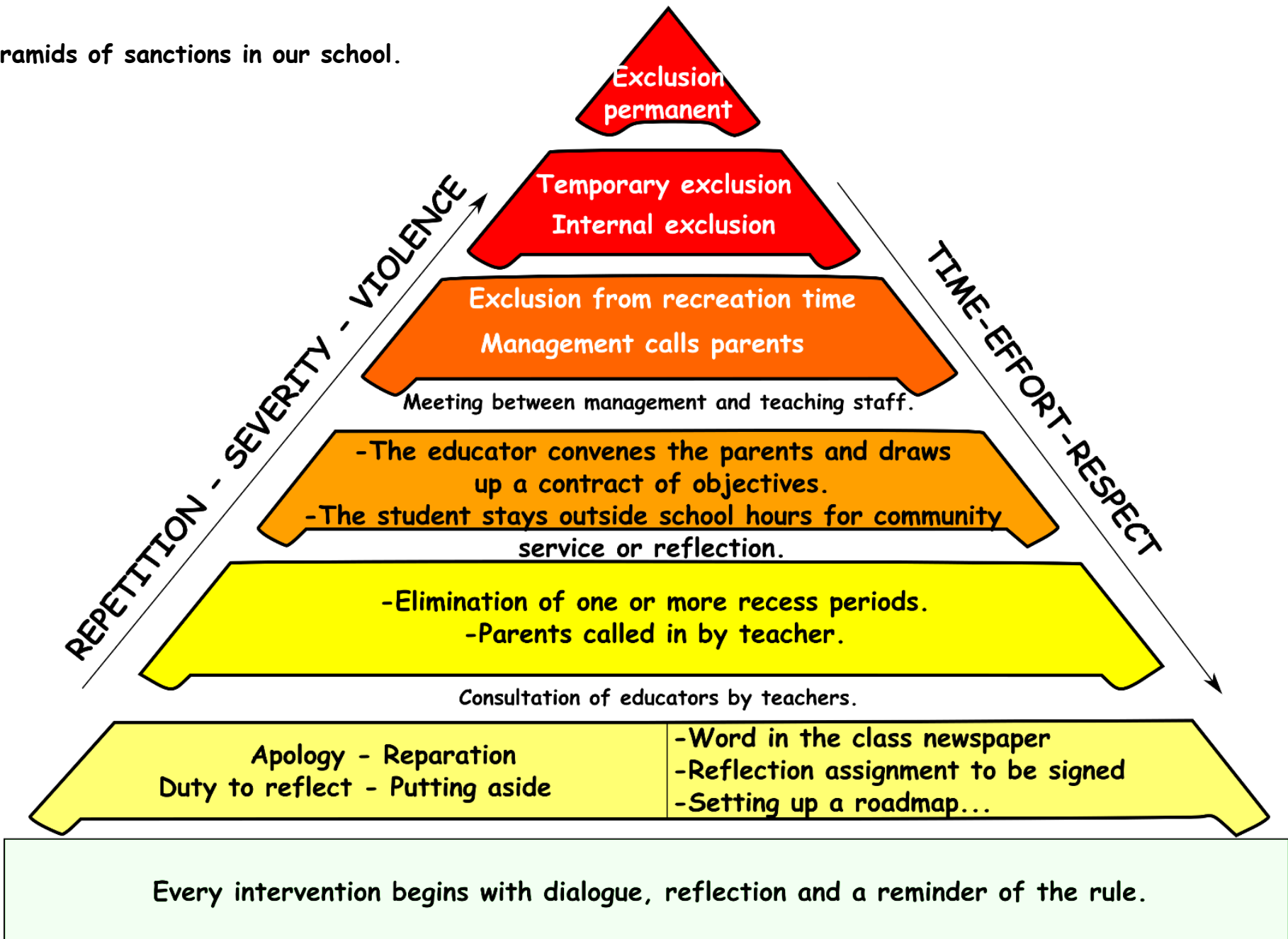
Our intervention begins with **dialogue, reflection and a reminder of the rule.** Depending on the seriousness and repetition of the offence, other **sanctions are**

possible.










- 1) I am punctual and bring with me the requested school materials, necessary to enable me to work/participate comfortably, properly and actively in class.
- 2) I bring a healthy, balanced snack and toast that is enough to keep me healthy and focused throughout the day.
- 3) I respect myself by taking care of my appearance, my clothing and my personal hygiene.
- 4) I do my best and give the best of myself when it comes to learning. I am the driving force behind my success.
- 5) I don't hesitate to ask adults at school for help when I encounter difficulties.
- 6) I speak French in class, except when I'm helping a classmate or family member to welcome them and support them in learning French.
