## Rough Estimate of Supplies:

### Threads usually in-house

"Enough" is enough to make whatever is requested, within reason. Full bolts of broadcloth.

"Some" is enough to embroider something heavily, but not weave with.

"A Little" is enough to make decorative accents for outfits, but no full outfits and not bedclothes

"Scraps" in the case of thread is enough to tie something to something else. In the case of cloth it is enough to patch something.

Uncommon dyes are blue, purple, violet, black, magenta (Tyrian Purple), teal, and turquoise.

#### How the shop is run:

##### Process:

1. First time customers or those experiencing body changes need to be measured.
  - a. Non-citizens pay at this stage
2. Supplies get ordered if needed.
3. Muslin "paper" cut-outs of the outfit are created, pinned to fabric, and the fabric is cut
  - a. Very rarely an article will be popular enough to reuse the muslin.
4. Basic stitches are put in to create a mockup of the outfit
5. Customer is called in to be fitted
  - a. Notes are left at the person's home or at the inn.
  - b. If the customer fails to come in within a fortnight, it is marked for re-sale
  - c. Citizens pay at this stage
6. Ornaments for the outfit are created and attached, final modifications are done
7. Customer is called in for pickup.
  - a. Attempted delivery occurs to the person's dwelling or to the inn, but is not left there.
  - b. If a non-citizen fails to come in within a fortnight, it is marked for re-sale

##### Rules:

- No refunds once cloth is cut.
- No letting the pattern books out of the shop.
- Strongly discourage customers from dressing above their station.
- Always encourage the Lord and Lady to purchase silk, satin, and velvet.
- Always try to upsell new underwear or a sewing kit.
- Remember to sell curtains, rugs, sheets, etc.
- No ruckus in shop; it's okay to eject arguing people.
- Orders from the Manor are put to the top of the queue.
- Orders from citizens are placed ahead of non-citizens.
- Non-employees may not use shop tools or machines.
- Do not sell cloth wholesale on-island.
- Measure twice, cut once.
- Double-check all lanterns before leaving.
- If possible, do not take out money-box in while customers are in store.
- Sell while you're shopping; ask if shop-owners need bags.
- OOC note: anachronistic clothing may not be sold without Raahs' approval, double cost of everything
- No letting naked people lounge around in store.

EXTRA FEES:

- Orders involving import fees get a %25 fee tacked on
- Orders involving major custom elements get a %10 fee tacked on
- Orders that involve a rare colour add %20
- Orders that might involve Illiandi being yelled at by the Lord get a %50 fee tacked on
- Orders that require hiring a temporary worker usually have the cost of said worker tacked on.
- Orders that require production stoppages (they take ALL of a supply or lock up a machine) get %10 tacked on.
