: m/s Wendy/Doe to approve financial report **Passed**

: m/s Wendy/Marilynn to maintain balance of \$800 in the kitchen fund with excess funds going towards the PRUC operating fund. **Passed**

: Tech Support Grant has been approved at the Regional level and has now gone on to National for approval

Trustee: The Insurance was confirmed renewed today at exactly the same rate as last year, \$11550. The extra \$500 premium that we had for the drop-in center which started last April for the Homeless was not renewed. Our payment schedule is monthly with the first payment starting Dec 15/25. We have not yet got those figures. This year for the first time, we will be paying a 1.6% charge to pay monthly.

We are insured under a large umbrella through the United Church of Canada. The UC underwrites a portion of our policy. Ecclesiastical and Intact Insurance companies are the underwriters of this year's policy.

Our insurance broker is Hub International out of Toronto. We do have a local representative in Vancouver serving us. He is good to deal with. (submitted by Al Barker)

Sacred Grounds: Maintenance report for Nov 2025...

- 1: 5 shelves were painted and installed in the storage locker for the Provision group.
- 2: 4 sliding shelves were built, painted and installed in the kitchen island for the Provision group.
- 3: a new tray rack was installed in the same island
- 4: the fire extinguishers were recertified for another year.
- 5: a new sump pump for the Church basement was installed, replacing the one installed in 2008
- 6: the Christmas tree was put up
- 7: The Lutheran Creche scene was installed in the parking lot. It is recommended that the members should drive up Duncan after dark to have a look at it when the spotlight is turned on. It is quite attractive.
- 8: the piano in the basement was given to a church member. It was removed on Saturday.
- 9: a light was repaired on one of the range hoods in the kitchen
- 10: a broken exterior outlet was repaired
- 11: Telus did a check of our alarm system last Wednesday. The Fire alarm system is no longer working. It is 30 years old so will probably need to be replaced. Arrangements will be made with Telus to look at the system. Our building was only partially alarmed in only 4 locations instead of every room to be considered fully alarmed. This may impact our insurance rate. (submitted by Al Barker)

- : Senior's Lunch... the numbers of attendees is growing...average attendance 30, up from 25 with peak at 40 and is operating under budget by \$500

- : Coffee served weekly; Sandwiches on the 4th Sundays and Soup/bun on the 2nd Sundays
- : a Valentine's pot luck is proposed for February for our church family (who may invite a friend along)
- : EDAS...going well. Cookie decorating party will be Dec 11th at 6:30pm

Caring and Sharing:

- : Pageant...Dec 14th...people have been contacted for various roles
- : Dec 18th at PHD, Christmas bags will be put together for folks not able to attend services

: PHD started off slowly but the numbers of attendees is picking up

: Christmas Market was a great success. Rod already has vendors interested in the Spring Market

: Harmony Vespers continues to be well attended. The season started with Ron Cambell in September, Simon Schump in October (who has come to regular services occasionally since then to play bass guitar with the music team), Vox Madrigal in November. Bookings have already been made from January 2026 to late spring.
