

# HAVE GOT

## AFFIRMATIVE FORM (+)

FULL FORM	SHORT FORM
I <b>have got</b>	I <b>'ve got</b>
You <b>have got</b>	You <b>'ve got</b>
He <b>has got</b>	He <b>'s got</b>
She <b>has got</b>	She <b>'s got</b>
It <b>has got</b>	It <b>'s got</b>
We <b>have got</b>	We <b>'ve got</b>
You <b>have got</b>	You <b>'ve got</b>
They <b>have got</b>	They <b>'ve got</b>

## NEGATIVE FORM (-)

FULL FORM	SHORT FORM
I <b>have not got</b>	I <b>haven't got</b>
You <b>have not got</b>	You <b>haven't got</b>
He <b>has not got</b>	He <b>hasn't got</b>
She <b>has not got</b>	She <b>hasn't got</b>
It <b>has not got</b>	It <b>hasn't got</b>
We <b>have not got</b>	We <b>haven't got</b>
You <b>have not got</b>	You <b>haven't got</b>
They <b>have not got</b>	They <b>haven't got</b>

## EXAMPLES (Eg.)

- I have got a pen.
- They haven't got any pens.
- He has got a headache.
- You have got a car.
- We have got pencils.
- She hasn't got any bottles.
- Have they got any fruit?
- We've got nice shoes.
- Has he got any news?
- I've got a new t-shirt.

# HAVE GOT

## AFFIRMATIVE FORM (+)

FULL FORM	SHORT FORM
I <b>have got</b>	I <b>'ve got</b>
You <b>have got</b>	You <b>'ve got</b>
He <b>has got</b>	He <b>'s got</b>
She <b>has got</b>	She <b>'s got</b>
It <b>has got</b>	It <b>'s got</b>
We <b>have got</b>	We <b>'ve got</b>
You <b>have got</b>	You <b>'ve got</b>
They <b>have got</b>	They <b>'ve got</b>

## NEGATIVE FORM (-)

FULL FORM	SHORT FORM
I <b>have not got</b>	I <b>haven't got</b>
You <b>have not got</b>	You <b>haven't got</b>
He <b>has not got</b>	He <b>hasn't got</b>
She <b>has not got</b>	She <b>hasn't got</b>
It <b>has not got</b>	It <b>hasn't got</b>
We <b>have not got</b>	We <b>haven't got</b>
You <b>have not got</b>	You <b>haven't got</b>
They <b>have not got</b>	They <b>haven't got</b>
