

2025 RPLL Safety Training (Cheat Sheet and Important Docs)

Goal: Provide a safe, fun environment for kids to enjoy the game, get exercise, and socialize with each other

Your Job:

Manager/Coaches: Aside from the baseball ... a manager understands the safety rules and plan; ensure team, staff, parents, spectators act in a safe manner and abide the safety rules; work with safety volunteer to establish safety rule compliance.

Safety Volunteer: A team safety volunteer is a second set of eyes focusing on safety. You understand all relevant safety rules and act as a safety advocate to team staff, parents and spectators. You are your managers partner to ensure all team activities are conducted in a safe environment.

Safety Officer: Ensure RPLL complies with all Little League International (LLI), Federal, State, and Local rules; develops and submits the safety plan to LLI annually; trains on safety; communicates safety issues to RPLL Board, Dist. 32 or LLI as required.

AED/Safety Kits:

- All Fields have a safety bins (ice pack, gauze, band aids, ointment, wipes, etc); as should all managers
- AEDs BMR in Safety Bin Outside Field 1; Canyonside at Fields 2, 3, 4, 6
- Snack Bar has a safety kit, ice, 2025 Safety Plan, shock blanket

The Do's:

Pre-Practice/Game To Dos:

- Open Safety Bins at the start of all practices and games (LOCK UP AFTER!)
- Managers make sure you have all of the safety forms (safety volunteers can be of help)
- Check for Snakes/Gophers
- Equipment
 - Bats Must be stamped USA (or BBCOR for IM or above); TBall only must say have
 Tball stamp (no Tball bats may be used above Tball
 - Cups this is mandatory
 - Helmets whenever players have a bat in hand or are catching. If catching (warm ups, game time, etc), helmet must have facemask with throat guard

During/After Game:

Arm Care - Work with manager on their plan for keeping track of pitch counts for Arm Care;
 watch for sore arms; work with families on other arm uses

- Bathroom Safety Buddy System and Parent Volunteer to ensure bathrooms are safe
- Only Manager and Two Coaches on field (Tball, Farm, Maps as needed may have dugout parent)
- Pick up Safety no player should never be left alone at the field
- Injury Reports must be submitted within 24 hours to <u>safety@rpll.org</u>; an injury is something that occurred during baseball activity and generally requires medical attention. May return only to play after medical leave with doctor clearance (contact <u>Playeragents@rpll.org</u> and Safety@rpll.org)
- Concussion Protocol
- Do feel free to contact Safety@rpll.org with any questions or concerns
- Remember: Please be aware for any potential abuse or other safety concerns (physical, social, emotional). Please contact <u>Playeragents@rpll.org</u> or safety@rpll.org (although only mandatory for managers, coaches and board - please consider taking the abuse awareness training at:

The Don'ts:

- No Food in the Dugout or On the Field
- No Gum or Seeds in Dugout or on the Field
- No jewelry (sorry sparkly necklaces, rings, watches, pins)
- No on deck circle (Majors and Below no exceptions)
- No headfirst sliding when advancing to a base (Majors and Below)
- No adult, including managers or coaches shall play catch with any uniformed player at a field of play on game day. Managers or coaches are permitted to warm up at home plate or bullpen at any time.
- No 1:1 interactions/rides home etc
