


DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #1 on the Earthquake Incident in Paluan, Occidental Mindoro

as of 15 January 2018, 6AM

Situation Overview



At 11:20 PM, 14 January 2018, an earthquake was felt 13.27°N, 120.24°E - 030 km S 57° W of Paluan (Occidental Mindoro) with a Depth of Focus of 7km and a Magnitude of 5.0.

An aftershock followed 13.26°N, 120.29°E - 026 km S 49° W of Paluan (Occidental Mindoro) at 11:49 PM with a Depth of Focus of 21km and a Magnitude of 5.2.

Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpiles and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱1,736,900,254.68** (see Table 3) with breakdown as follows:

a. Stockpiles

A total of **321,756 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** (see Table 4) amounting to **₱106,766,889.53** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱339,976,347.35**.

b. Standby Funds

A total of **₱1,290,157,017.80** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱1,250,000,000.00** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.
