# APID/A Resource Guide on the U-M Strike

The U-M APID/A Staff Association Core Team has compiled a shortlist of information around the timeline, (re)sources, list of GEO actions, and statements of support. In recognition of the precarity of staff, we provide this as a resource to help APID/A staff process information around recent events on an individual level. Although the strike has ended, there is value in contextualizing how the University arrived at this 'fractured' moment and we recognize that these challenges and movements are ongoing.

### Background

- The <u>Graduate Employees' Organization</u> (GEO) organized a strike that started after Labor Day on September 8, 2020 and ended on September 16. The strike coincided with the <u>#ScholarStrike</u> and <u>Abolitionist Strike</u>, which are meant to center anti-racist movements and demands. GEO had been striking for 12-hours per day. They have notably been supporting quarantined students donating supplies to them on North Campus.
- This is the second strike that has taken place at U-M. The first took place in 1975 and was also organized by GEO.
- The state of Michigan has been historically unfriendly to teacher strikes, however <u>'illegal' strikes have been common in the state</u>.
- Numerous undergraduates have stood in solidarity with GEO and have skipped classes so they don't cross the picket line (see GEO List of Possible Actions in Solidarity to learn more about picketing and what crossing the picket line means when many of us are working remotely).
