Participant Roles and Responsibilities

The term participant encompasses many groups of people, not just those playing in the exercise. Groups of participants involved in the exercise, and their respective roles and responsibilities, are as follows:

- Players: Personnel who have an active role in discussing or performing their regular roles and responsibilities during the exercise. Players discuss or initiate actions in response to the simulated emergency.
- **Observers:** Do not directly participate in the exercise. However, they may support the development of player responses to the situation during the discussion by asking relevant questions or providing subject matter expertise.
- Facilitators: Provide situation updates and moderate discussions. They also provide additional information or resolve questions as required. Key Exercise Planning Team members also may assist with facilitation as subject matter experts (SMEs) during the exercise.
- **Evaluators:** Are assigned to observe and document certain objectives during the exercise. Their primary role is to document player discussions, including how and if those discussions conform to plans, polices, and procedures.

Exercise Structure

This exercise will be a multimedia, facilitated exercise. Players will participate in the following 3 modules:

- Module 1: Resource Management and Economic Strategy
- Module 2: Community Engagement and Resilience Building
- Module 3: Stakeholder Coordination and Communication Flow

Each module begins with a multimedia update that summarizes key events occurring within that time period. After the updates, participants review the situation and engage in functional group discussions of appropriate [focus area] issues. For this exercise, the functional groups are as follows:

After these functional group discussions, participants will engage in a moderated plenary discussion in which a spokesperson from each group will present a synopsis of the group's actions, based on the scenario.

Exercise Guidelines

- This exercise will be held in an open, no-fault environment wherein capabilities, plans, systems, and processes will be evaluated. Varying viewpoints, even disagreements, are expected.
- Respond to the scenario using your knowledge of current plans and capabilities (i.e., you may use only existing assets) and insights derived from your training.
- Decisions are not precedent setting and may not reflect your jurisdiction's/ organization's final position on a given issue. This exercise is an opportunity to discuss and present multiple options and possible solutions.
- Issue identification is not as valuable as suggestions and recommended actions that could improve [focus area] efforts. Problem-solving efforts should be the focus.
- The assumption is that the exercise scenario is plausible and events occur as they are presented. All players will receive information at the same time.

Exercise Evaluation

Evaluation of the exercise is based on the exercise objectives and aligned capabilities, capability targets, and critical tasks, which are documented in Exercise Evaluation Guides (EEGs). Evaluators have EEGs for each of their assigned areas. Additionally, players will be asked to complete participant feedback forms. These documents, coupled with facilitator observations and notes, will be used to evaluate the exercise and compile the After-Action Report (AAR)/Improvement Plan (IP)

Module 1: Resource Management and Economic Strategy

Scenario

This module focuses on managing economic recovery strategies in Atlantic City, inspired by the strategic resource allocation dynamics found in Monopoly. Participants will collaborate to assess resource distribution, prioritize economic stability measures, and foster stakeholder communication to enhance economic resilience. The goal is to improve decision-making and develop strategies that balance competition with community collaboration.

Key Issues

- On Monday morning, local news outlets report a sudden 50% drop in tourism at
 attractions equivalent to Boardwalk and Park Place. This prompts city officials to
 convene an emergency meeting to discuss strategies to boost marketing efforts and
 invest in promotional campaigns aimed at attracting visitors back to these critical
 economic zones.
- By Monday afternoon, businesses along Marvin Gardens and Baltic Avenue encounter a severe shortage of essential supplies, reminiscent of landing on a Monopoly tax square without sufficient funds. Economic development teams are tasked with reallocating city resources, prioritizing supply acquisitions, and negotiating with distant suppliers to stabilize operations.
- Early Tuesday, a high-stakes auction for key tourist properties, analogous to a Monopoly property acquisition, begins attracting interest from international investors. This event requires city economic strategists to assess potential impacts on local businesses and develop a counter-strategy to ensure competitive equality and fair resource distribution.
- On Tuesday afternoon, an uncoordinated announcement from a local event organizer leads to confusion and miscommunication between businesses on Ventnor Avenue and city officials, mirroring the consequences of a poorly planned Monopoly deal. This situation reinforces the need for improved communication channels and coordinated messaging strategies.
- Wednesday morning, social media buzzes with concerns about potential development on Mediterranean Avenue, leading to community unrest regarding possible displacement and economic inequality. City agencies must develop an inclusive public engagement strategy to address community concerns while fostering economic resilience and equity.

Ouestions

Based on the information provided, participate in the discussion concerning the issues raised in Module 1. Identify any critical issues, decisions, requirements, or questions that should be addressed at this time.

The following questions are provided as suggested subjects that you may wish to address as the discussion progresses. These questions are not meant to constitute a definitive list of concerns to be addressed, nor is there a requirement to address every question.

[Functional Group]

- 1. Considering Atlantic City's current economic status, like a Monopoly board with several properties in distress, how should resources be prioritized across different business districts, such as Baltic Avenue and Marvin Gardens, to maximize recovery?
- 2. Real estate values are fluctuating akin to Park Place and Boardwalk shifts. What strategies could be employed to adapt to these changes and stabilize the economic environments for businesses heavily reliant on tourism?
- 3. In the way players negotiate and trade properties to gain a competitive edge in Monopoly, how should stakeholders communicate and collaborate to optimize resource sharing and minimize economic competition impacts?
- 4. Reflecting on strategies to attract visitors, as players aim to increase the value of their properties through houses and hotels, what innovative marketing approaches could be pursued to boost local business traffic on Atlantic City's equivalent of Ventnor Avenue?
- 5. With certain areas like Mediterranean Avenue facing heightened risk due to resource shortages, how should public service agencies adjust their strategies to effectively address basic needs and support community resilience?

Module 2: Community Engagement and Resilience Building

Scenario

This module focuses on strengthening community engagement and building resilience in Atlantic City amidst economic challenges. Participants will assess existing community support systems and design strategies to foster local involvement and collaboration. The goal is to enhance community ties and improve resilience planning, ensuring that all members of the community are supported and empowered to navigate economic adversities.

Key Issues

- On Thursday morning, a proposal to develop a luxury hotel on the equivalent of Atlantic City's Boardwalk stirs public debate. Community leaders call for a town hall meeting to discuss potential economic benefits versus the risk of gentrification and loss of local charm.
- Friday afternoon sees tensions rise as rumors spread about the demolition of historic buildings on Marvin Gardens, sparking protests. Local heritage societies and business owners urgently convene to develop a preservation strategy, highlighting the need for transparent communication between stakeholders.
- Over the weekend, organizers of a community festival on Baltic Avenue face logistical issues, akin to navigating the strategic pitfalls of a Monopoly game.
 Misplaced bookings cause vendor delays, necessitating swift coordination with local authorities to ensure the event proceeds smoothly and supports local businesses.
- Monday morning, a surge in demand for services from public agencies in areas
 equivalent to Mediterranean Avenue uncovers gaps in resource allocation, similar to
 poorly managed Monopoly resources. Social services must reevaluate their strategies
 to ensure equitable support for all residents.
- By Tuesday afternoon, conflicting reports circulate about potential zoning changes in the equivalent of Park Place, causing confusion among residents and businesses. The city council is tasked with clarifying the situation, reinforcing the importance of clear communication channels in maintaining community trust.

Questions

Based on the information provided, participate in the discussion concerning the issues raised in Module 2. Identify any critical issues, decisions, requirements, or questions that should be addressed at this time.

The following questions are provided as suggested subjects that you may wish to address as the discussion progresses. These questions are not meant to constitute a definitive list of concerns to be addressed, nor is there a requirement to address every question.

[Functional Group]

- 1. How can Atlantic City's community assets be mobilized to support resilience and economic recovery across distressed areas like Baltic Avenue and Marvin Gardens?
- 2. What creative strategies can be developed to increase community participation and engagement in local resilience initiatives, and how can the effectiveness of these strategies be measured?

- 3. In areas facing challenges akin to Mediterranean Avenue's resource shortages, how should public service agencies redirect their efforts to ensure equitable resource distribution and prevent displacement or disadvantage among vulnerable populations?
- 4. What collaborative efforts between local businesses, government, and community groups can be fostered to strengthen economic resilience and community ties?
- 5. What indicators should be used to evaluate community resilience against ongoing economic challenges, and how can these metrics guide future planning efforts?

Module 3: Stakeholder Coordination and Communication Flow

Scenario

This module focuses on enhancing coordination and improving communication strategies among key stakeholders in Atlantic City during economic recovery efforts. Participants will engage in evaluating existing communication channels, developing interagency coordination plans, and addressing communication gaps observed during crisis management. The goal is to foster stronger collaboration, ensure effective information dissemination, and enhance decision-making processes to support comprehensive economic recovery strategies.

Key Issues

- On Thursday morning, a critical miscommunication occurs between city officials and local business leaders, reminiscent of players misunderstanding a trade agreement in Monopoly. Conflicting public announcements about new economic recovery measures lead to confusion among stakeholders. This situation necessitates an urgent review and update of existing communication protocols to align all parties and prevent future discrepancies.
- By Friday afternoon, an unexpected influx of tourists, akin to drawing a 'Chance' card
 in Monopoly, overwhelms the city's public transportation system. Stakeholders must
 rapidly convene to devise a coordinated response plan to manage the increased
 demand while maintaining public safety and ensuring minimal disruption to local
 businesses.
- During the weekend, misinformation spreads on social media about a proposed infrastructure project, much like rumors impacting property values on the Monopoly board. City agencies need to act swiftly, collaborating with communication experts to manage public perception and correct false narratives before they escalate further.
- On Monday morning, communication breakdowns between emergency services and healthcare facilities delay resource allocations to vulnerable neighborhoods, echoing the chaos of poorly planned Monopoly turns. This scenario underscores the urgency of addressing gaps in interagency communication channels to improve response coordination for all community members.
- By Tuesday afternoon, disagreements among regional partners over resource allocation mirror strategic discord among Monopoly players competing for prime properties. This disharmony prompts an urgent reevaluation of coordination strategies to better align the goals and reinforce collaborative efforts among agencies.

Ouestions

Based on the information provided, participate in the discussion concerning the issues raised in Module 3. Identify any critical issues, decisions, requirements, or questions that should be addressed at this time.

The following questions are provided as suggested subjects that you may wish to address as the discussion progresses. These questions are not meant to constitute a definitive list of concerns to be addressed, nor is there a requirement to address every question.

[Functional Group]

- 1. Considering how communication failures can disrupt synergy, akin to losing strategic opportunities in Monopoly, what improvements can be made to ensure effective information flow between stakeholders in Atlantic City?
- 2. Similar to the alliances formed to negotiate trades in Monopoly, how can we strengthen interagency coordination during crisis management to enhance decision-making and resource allocation processes?
- 3. What are the potential communication gaps that may arise during stakeholder interactions, and how can we preemptively address these to prevent confusion and mismanagement in emergency response efforts?
- 4. Reflecting on the strategic management of properties in Monopoly, what strategies can be implemented to optimize resource distribution and resource sharing among key stakeholders to bolster community recovery?
- 5. How can past instances of miscommunication be analyzed to develop practices that ensure clarity and coherence in messages disseminated among diverse stakeholder groups in economic recovery contexts?

The Master Scenario Events List is a chronological timeline of expected actions and scripted events to be injected into exercise play by facilitators/controllers to generate or prompt player activity. It ensures necessary events happen so that all exercise objectives can be met. This template should be utilized to track each of the individual events within the scenario and those expected actions of personnel and the learning points associated with those actions.
