

Glossary of PB and various linkages

This glossary starts from Paul Brunton's "base term" for certain concepts or ideas and includes the equivalent terms (synonyms) most commonly used by Brunton himself. It also adds some terms with a certain (or absolute) "overlap" from other authors or traditions, whether philosophical, mystical or religious, so that they are, in fact, corresponding rather than equivalent terms, i.e. their meaning is very similar, but not always identical, as each author or tradition has given each term its own nuances.

PB: Mind or Mind in Itself...

- (1) Mind alone, One Mind, Pure Mind, Single Consciousness...
- (2) Mind-essence, Over-Mind (or Overmind), Ultimate Single Mind, One Ever-Existent Mind, First Mind, First Cause, Great Void, No-thing (or Nothingness)...
- (3) *Of a religious or philosophical nature*: "The Father" in correspondence to the Holy Trinity
- (4) [Hinduism] Brahman or Brahma immanifested, Tat (Absolute Existence)
- (5) [Chinese Taoism] Tao (the Significance), Tat Chi (The Great Extreme)
- (6) [Neoplatonism, Plotinus] The One

PB: World-Mind...

- (1) [Consciousness, Being, Self, Principle, Mind] Universal, Divine, Infinite, Silent, Primordial...
- (2) the Soul of the Universe, World-Soul, Divine Ideation, the First Intelligence, Eternal Intelligence, One Infinite Life-Power, Universal Life-Force, God's Great Silence
- (3) *Of a religious or philosophical nature*: God, the Divine, the Creator, Godhead, Deity, Divinity, Gods, Goddesses, the One, the Almighty, the Unknown God, the Father, the Lord, Yahveh, Jehovah, Alaha, Allah, Yin and Yang, TAO, TAT CHI, TAT...; "The Son" in correspondence to the Holy Trinity
- (4) [Hinduism] Ishvara (or Brahman manifested)
- (5) [Chinese Taoism] Teh
- (6) [Neoplatonism, Plotinus] The One (manifested)
- (7) [Stoicism] Logos (Universal Law and Order)

PB: Overself or Soul...

- (1) The "Self" or the "Being": Higher, Real, Spiritual, essential, central, true, inner, inmost, innermost, deeper, deepest, internal, interior, indestructible, undivided, ultimate, invisible, impersonal, immutable, divine, godlike, benign...
- (2) The divine Soul, the final essential self, the light-self, the Christ-Self...
- (3) *Of a religious or philosophical nature*: "The Holy Spirit" in correspondence to the Holy Trinity.
- (4) [Hinduism] Adhyâtman, Atman, Atma
- (5) [Chinese Taoism] Soul
- (6) [Neoplatonism, Plotinus] Nous
- (7) [Stoicism] "the divinity which is planted in his breast" of Marcus Aurelius; "your guardian spirit" of Epictetus
- (8) [Ramana and others] the Self: "the mind turned inward is the Self"; other names: the "Heart" with the more specific meaning of "Centre of Being"; also, the Witness, and sometimes "I-ness"; the 'I-I' with the meaning of 'I am I' (as opposed to 'I am this' or 'I am the body')

PB: Ego...

- (1) [the being, self, or consciousness] lower, ordinary, personal, dual, separate, intellectual, emotional, individualized, the individual self, being or soul...; the lower mind, the personal ego, ego-personality, the entity ego, the person, the individual...
- (2) the false self, the false "I", the pseudo-self, the illusory self...
- (3) [Ramana and others] "the mind turned inward is the Self; turned outward, it becomes the ego", the "I" thought, the externalized mind, the psychological mind...
