The firing is done in traditional kilns, fueled with natural materials such as coconut shells, giving the pottery its warm hue and characteristic strength.

This local village in Ben Tre appeals to visitors with its peaceful atmosphere and warm welcome. Coming here, you will have the chance not only to observe the artisans at work but also to get your hands dirty in participatory workshops.
