

DotCollaborate FAQ

1. What is DotCollaborate?

DotCollaborate is a collaboration-focused platform designed for the **Polkadot ecosystem**. It aims to connect projects and contributors, providing tools for posting job listings, managing tasks, and working collaboratively. The platform will also include DotImpact, a feature to contribute towards charitable and environmental initiatives, making a social impact while growing the community.

2. How will DotCollaborate benefit the Polkadot community?

DotCollaborate is built to provide a **centralized hub** for projects and contributors to connect efficiently. It allows projects to find the right talent and contributors to discover suitable job opportunities. The inclusion of DotImpact also allows users to contribute to social causes, enhancing the community's shared values and impact.

3. What features will DotCollaborate include?

DotCollaborate will include several core features:

- **User Profiles and Online CVs** to match contributors with suitable job listings.
- **Project Boards** for managing tasks, job listings, and milestones.
- **Verified Public Pages** for projects to post updates and connect with others.
- **Messaging System** to facilitate communication between users.
- **Community Voting** to decide on feature development and social initiatives.
- **Payment and Escrow System** (in future phases) to facilitate secure transactions.
- **DotImpact** for charitable donations and environmental contributions.

4. How will DotImpact work?

DotImpact will collect a **5% fee** from transactions conducted on DotCollaborate. The funds will be pooled, and each month, projects that paid this fee will have the opportunity to vote on which **charity or social cause** the funds should go to. This ensures community-driven allocation, and every donation will be transparent, allowing projects to showcase their contributions.

5. What is included in Mini Proposal 1?

Mini Proposal 1 focuses on the foundational work for DotCollaborate, including:

- **UI/UX Design** to create an intuitive, user-friendly interface.
- **Database Design** to set up a scalable and secure data structure.

- **Basic Login System** to enable user registration and secure authentication. This mini proposal is part of Phase 1 and aims to demonstrate early progress by delivering these initial features with a budget of **\$50,000 USDT**.

6. Why is the project being broken into mini proposals?

The project is broken into mini proposals to **build trust** with the Polkadot community by delivering results in smaller, manageable parts. Since the team is new to the community, this approach allows for transparency and gives stakeholders confidence in the team's ability to deliver on their promises.

7. How will the community be involved in the development process?

The community will be actively involved in the development process through:

- **Voting on features** they want to prioritize for future development.
- **Providing feedback** via community forums, surveys, and user testing.

8. How will DotCollaborate sustain itself in the long run?

DotCollaborate plans to be self-sustaining through several **revenue streams**:

- **Premium Features** such as advanced analytics and project tools available on a subscription basis.
- **Advertising Opportunities** for related services.
- **White-Label Solutions** for organizations that want their own branded versions of the platform.

9. What measures are being taken to ensure security?

Security is a top priority for DotCollaborate. Measures include:

- **Secure Database Design** to protect user data.
- **SSL Encryption** for secure data transmission.
- **Regular Audits** to identify and address vulnerabilities.
- **Role-Based Access** to limit user permissions and maintain data integrity.

10. What authentication method will DotCollaborate include?

Users will be able to log in via their **wallet**, **Social Media Profiles**, or **email**. Regardless of their preferred login method, they will need to **link their wallet** and add an **email address**. Once linked, they can safely log in using any of the above methods, providing flexibility while ensuring secure authentication.

11. How will DotCollaborate and DotImpact work beyond their core features?

Both DotCollaborate and DotImpact are designed to be flexible and extend beyond their core functionalities. We are planning to develop an **API** that will allow other services and applications to **exchange data** with our platform. This means that projects will be able to **embed posts on their own websites**, receive **notifications for CV submissions** on other platforms, and facilitate smooth integration with external systems. This API will enhance the usability of DotCollaborate and allow seamless connectivity with other tools and platforms.

12. How did you learn about Polkadot and what inspired you to create this proposal?

I first discovered **Polkadot** a few years ago through my involvement in cryptocurrency trading. A friend who was actively holding DOT mentioned it to me, sparking my curiosity. After that, I spent several weeks researching Polkadot, learning about its ecosystem, and engaging with the community to better understand its unique capabilities. I was impressed by Polkadot's ability to connect different blockchains, enabling them to communicate and share value seamlessly. This ecosystem's strong community and its focus on creating an interconnected Web3 inspired me to become a part of it.

The idea for **DotCollaborate** emerged from recognizing a need for a **collaborative hub** where projects and contributors could connect and work efficiently, combined with a platform for positive social impact. I saw the potential to make a real difference by not only addressing practical collaboration needs but also enabling community members to contribute to **social and environmental causes** through **DotImpact**. This proposal is my way of contributing to Polkadot's vision and helping empower the community.

13. How will the funds be used?

The funds requested for DotCollaborate will be used to cover the expenses of our development, design, and marketing teams. The **USDT** will be transferred to exchanges and converted to **FIAT** as needed, allowing us to pay our team and cover operational costs. This process will be done in **incremental steps**, ensuring that only the required amount is converted at any given time to meet specific milestones, maintaining financial transparency and minimizing risk.
