George J. Lindner, 83, of Medina, OH, formally of Oshkosh, died January 9, 2004 at his home in Medina. George was born October 12, 1920 a son of George and Anna (Friday) Lindner. George married Bernice Woldt December 19, 1945 in Oshkosh. They celebrated 58 years of marriage this past December.



George served his country in the U.S. Army during World War II in the 32nd Red Arrow Division where he was a Staff Sergeant in the Pacific. He was an Oshkosh Police Officer for 35 years until his retirement in 1981 as a Sergeant. He was a charter member at St. Andrew Evangelical Lutheran Church in Oshkosh, a member of Prince of Peace Evangelical Lutheran Church, Medina, and a member of the Fraternal Order of the Wisconsin Professional Police Association, and

the Oshkosh V.F.W. Post 1908.

He is survived by his wife, Bernice of Medina, a daughter, Patricia (John C. Sr) Lehmann of Medina, granddaughter, Jana (David) Gerding of Charlottesville, VA, and a grandson, John C. Lehmann Jr of Arlington, VA.

S/Sgt. George J. Lindner, son of George Lindner, 34 Jefferson avenue, is returning home under the demobilization plan from duty with the 32nd infantry division on northern Luzon. He entered with the national guard unit here in October, 1940, and went overseas with the unit in April, 1942. He wears the presidential citation ribbon, the theater ribbon with four battle stars, combat infantryman badge, good conduct medal and Philippine liberation medal.

S/Sgt. George J. Lindner, son of George Lindner, 34 Jefferson avenue, is beginning his fourth year of overseas duty with the 32nd (Red Arrow division. He has been in service since October, 1940, leaving for Australia in April, 1942. He fought in the battle of Buna and was awarded the presidential unit citation. Since then he has participated in three major engagements. Supply sergeant in an infantry company, he is on Luzon at present and holds the combat infantryman badge. He graduated from Oshkosh High school in 1938.
